Diversity is part of Ameren Missouri's corporate core principles. That's why we're proud to salute a long-time friend, Attorney Frankie Muse Freeman. During Black History Month, we're proud that Missouri has courageous African-American men and women who have carried the torch as "firsts" and have used their skills, voices and intellect to change the landscape of racial equality.

Missourians Josephine Baker, Grace Bumbry and Chuck Berry successfully used their artistry to be accepted by the nation as exceptional crossover musical geniuses. Maya Angelou and Langston Hughes used their introspective and profound writing skills and voices to help lift every voice during troubling times in our nation's history. Businesswoman Annie Malone pursued economic empowerment, providing jobs to many before it was commonly allowed in some parts of America.

Some 69 years ago, Attorney Frankie Muse Freeman and her family traveled a long and rocky segregated road from Danville, Virginia to St. Louis, Missouri for a new frontier to better their quality of life. She wanted to use her legal skills, energy and intellect to banish the Jim Crow era.

Attorney Freeman had doors slammed in her face, but refused to give into hopelessness, sexism and discrimination against herself and her African-American neighbors. Her determination, her persona of dignity and keen leadership skills led this young attorney successfully over obstacles. After opening her own law firm, she became lead attorney for the landmark NAACP case Davis et al. v. St. Louis Housing Authority. Her efforts helped end segregation in public housing.

Attorney Freeman was the first woman to serve as a member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. She brought a distinctive view to the all-white male commission. She was appointed by President Lyndon B. Johnson in 1964 and reappointed by Presidents Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter. Freeman had successfully engaged the commission in Southern fact-finding missions to document racial hatred and bigotry and recommend ways for America to move forward. She was also appointed inspector General of the Community Services



Michael P. McMillan Uses Passion, Partnerships & Energy to Empower Black Lives

A studious and inquisitive ten-year-old, Michael Patrick McMillan learned about the social service and advocacy works of the Urban League of Greater St. Louis through his great uncle - Clifton W. Gates, then a noted banker, realtor and entrepreneur. Gates also had served as board chair of the well-established group during a turbulent 1968 -- the same year Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated. In 1988, McMillan decided to join the prestigious life-changing group as a youth member.

Long before he became president/CEO of the 5-star St. Louis Urban League, young McMillan served as a city alderman, a St. Louis license collector and former president of the Young Democrats, executing social service and even self-help projects to give area seniors and young adults respect and resources. His fondness for the elderly is a clear reflection of his realization at an early age that he stood on the shoulders of those who laid the foundation so that he and others could advance forward.

McMillan is known for his quiet yet effective approaches to analyzing social issues. He uses his partnership skills, passion and indefatigable energy to help confront complex societal challenges with solutions. McMillan developed and refined these skills while earning a degree in African-American studies from St. Louis University with a minor in political science and an emphasis in finance. This is the same McMillan who earned an Eisenhower International Fellowship, traveling to Ireland and Paris to study how other forms of government work.

When the Ferguson crisis erupted, it became an international nightmare for the St. Louis region. The situation was due to long-standing questionable police practices, lack of minority police hiring, generational poverty, lack of jobs and economic opportunities and a stressful status on affordable housing in North County, not to mention
