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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE JORDAN: We're on the record now. The
3	Commission is calling the cases in the following file numbers:
4	File No. ER-2012-0174 and File No. ER-2012-0175.
5	Do we have someone just join us on the line?
6	CAPTAIN MILLER: Yes. This is Captain Sam
7	Miller with Federal Executive Agencies.
8	JUDGE JORDAN: Good morning. Glad to have you
9	with us.
10	Is there anyone else on the line?
11	MR. BRUDER: Yes, there is. Terry Bruder for
12	the Department of Energy the United States Department of
13	Energy.
14	JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you very much. This is
15	Daniel Jordan, the regulatory law judge assigned to this case.
16	MR. BRUDER: Okay.
17	JUDGE JORDAN: And the first thing I want to
18	tell everyone is that we've had a consolidation of actions.
19	This morning the Commission issued its order of consolidation
20	with File No. EU-2012-0130 and that is the application for an
21	accounting authority order for Kansas City Power and Light
22	Company.
23	I will give a brief description of the format of
24	this conference for anyone who's unfamiliar with it. That is as
25	follows: We'll take entries of appearance. We're on the record

now. We will deal with any preliminary matters that the parties 1 2 have for me, such as I can and then we will go off the record so 3 that the parties may discuss issues and use this space and time. I have set aside this room all week. That's for 4 5 the flexibility of the parties. Don't feel like you need to use 6 this time. In an earlier order, I've asked Staff to let me know 7 when the parties feel they will be done with this so that we can 8 free up the room. This is all strictly for the convenience of 9 the parties. 10 And with that, I will begin taking entries of 11 appearance. And what I'll do is assume, unless I'm otherwise 12 informed, that associations or persons as identified in the 13 order granting applications for intervention are those listed in 14 the appendices to those orders. 15 If -- if an association has changed its 16 configuration as to its constituent entities, then let me know 17 otherwise and they'll be considered to be the same thing. 18 MR. WILLIAMS: Judge? 19 JUDGE JORDAN: Yes? 20 MR. WILLIAMS: Do you want parties to identify which case they are parties to, making an appearance in, because 21 22 I know some parties are only in one of the two. 23 JUDGE JORDAN: That's correct. And the associations, in fact, have different configurations per case. 24 But what I'll do when I call -- when I ask for an entry of 25

appearance for each party, we will assume that those are as they 2 are reflected in the respective file numbers. 3 MR. WILLIAMS: So you're going to go file number 4 by file number? 5 JUDGE JORDAN: No. I'm going to go party by party. And so when I come -- when I -- when I ask for an 6 7 association, someone enters an appearance, in each case number 8 it will reflect the constituent parties in that file number. 9 Okay? 10 Anything else before we go any further? 11 All right. Then I will begin with the 12 applicants, Kansas City Power and Light Company and KCP&L 13 Greater Missouri Operations Company. 14 MR. STEINER: Your Honor, let the record reflect 15 the appearance for Kansas City Power and Light Company and KCP&L 16 Greater Missouri Operations Company, Roger W. Steiner and Jim 17 Fischer. Our addresses have previously been supplied to the 18 court reporter. 19 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 20 And for Staff? 21 MR. WILLIAMS: Kevin Thompson, Nathan Williams 22 and Sarah Kliethermes in both cases. 23 JUDGE JORDAN: And for the Office of Public 24 Counsel?

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MR. MILLS: On behalf of the Office of Public

Counsel and the public my name is Lewis Mills. My address is 1 2 Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102. 3 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. And now we'll start 4 with the intervenors. We will begin with AARP and the Consumer 5 Council of Missouri. 6 MR. COFFMAN: Appearing in both cases for both organizations, AARP and the Consumers Council of Missouri, my 7 name's John B. Coffman. 8 9 JUDGE JORDAN: And your address is on file with 10 the reporter? You have given --11 MR. COFFMAN: Yes, it is. 12 JUDGE JORDAN: -- the address to the reporter? 13 Good. 14 For Ag Processing Inc. 15 MR. CONRAD: Judge, for Ag Processing, Inc --16 and that's -- would be in GMO proceeding, they are joined by 17 SIEUA in that proceeding and also for Praxair in the 0174 18 docket. And I believe -- I didn't know about the consolidation 19 until I was on the way down this morning, but I believe SIEUA is 20 in that proceeding also. It ends in 0130. And I have -- this 21 is Stu Conrad with Finnegan, Conrad and Peterson, Kansas City. 22 I have provided our address to the reporter. JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you, counselor. 23 24 For the City of Kansas City, Missouri. 25 MR. COMLEY: Good morning, Judge. Let the

1 record reflect the entry of Mark W. Comley on behalf of the City 2 of Kansas City and that would be in both of the rate case 3 filings made by KCP&L and -- my business address is 601 Monroe, Suite 301, Jefferson City, Missouri. 4 5 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 6 For Dogwood Energy, LLC. 7 MR. LUMLEY: Good morning, Judge. Carl Lumley 8 appearing for Dogwood in both cases. 9 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 10 For Midwest Energy Consumers Group. 11 MR. WOODSMALL: Thank you, Your Honor. David 12 Woodsmall appearing on behalf MECG in both cases. I have 13 previously provided my address to the Commission. 14 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 15 For the Midwest Energy Users Association. 16 MR. FINNEGAN: Appearing in the 0174 case Jeremiah D. Finnegan; Finnegan, Conrad and Peterson. 17 The address has been supplied. 18 19 JUDGE JORDAN: For the Missouri Department of 20 Natural Resources. 21 MS. BLOME: Jessica Blome, Your Honor, with the 22 Attorney General's Office. Address, P.O. Box 899, Jefferson 23 City, Missouri, 65102. 24 JUDGE JORDAN: For the Missouri Industrial 25 Energy Consumers.

1 MS. VUYLSTEKE: Diana Vuylsteke of the law firm 2 Bryan Cave, LLP, 211 North Broadway, Suite 3600, St. Louis, 3 Missouri, 63102. 4 JUDGE JORDAN: There was one motion for 5 application for intervention from Sierra Club Earth Island 6 Institute doing business as Renew Missouri and National 7 Resources Defense Counsel. Will counsel enter an appearance for 8 those entities? 9 I'm not hearing anyone. 10 And for the Union -- for Union Electric Company 11 doing business as Ameren Missouri, I have excused their 12 appearance. 13 Yes, counsel? 14 MS. TATRO: Wendy Tatro for Ameren Missouri. 15 We'd ask to be excused because we had a hearing next door, but 16 it's over, so I would enter my appearance. Wendy Tatro, 1901 Choteau Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri, 63103. 17 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 18 19 Also we have some -- an application for 20 intervention pending from a cluster of federal agencies. Would 21 counsel like to enter an appearance for the federal agencies? 22 I'm not hearing any. I'm not hearing counsel. 23 CAPTAIN MILLER: Is that -- this is Captain Sam 24 Miller representing the federal executive agencies in both cases. Our address has been previously provided. 25

1 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you, counsel. 2 MR. BRUDER: Also Terry Bruder for the U.S. 3 Department of Energy and the National Nuclear Security 4 Administration, 1000 Independence Avenue Southwest, Washington 5 D.C., 20585. Telephone number 202.586.3409. 6 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you, counsel. 7 Well, the only thing that I had to announce this 8 morning was the consolidation of this action of the accounting 9 authority order. What else would the parties like to bring to 10 me? 11 MR. COOPER: Your Honor, on behalf of Southern 12 Union Company doing business as Missouri Gas Energy, Dean L. 13 Cooper appearing in both cases. And the address has been 14 provided to the reporter. 15 JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. I did grant that 16 application for intervention recently. 17 Anyone else? 18 Okay. And does anyone have an procedural 19 matters for me before we -- before we go off the record and 20 leave you to your work? 21 MR. CONRAD: Judge, you have clarified earlier 22 and you just might do so again about the additional days on this 23 prehearing. JUDGE JORDAN: Sure. I scheduled several days 24 25 for this. And this is -- the scheduling and the availability of

this room is for the parties' convenience. I don't want to -- I 1 2 don't want anyone to think that they have to use the time -- all 3 the time that's reserved. This is just for the parties. And 4 I've asked Staff to let me know when -- what days are not 5 necessary and I will release the room. 6 Is there anything else before we go off the 7 record and adjourn this part --8 MR. BRUDER: Terry Bruder. Can you hear me? 9 JUDGE JORDAN: Yes. Yes, counsel. MR. BRUDER: As you know, the actions on our 10 11 motions to intervene had been held in abeyance pending a 12 participation pending a formal appearance by counsel who is 13 admitted in Missouri. As of yesterday DOE counsel, Ms. Lelanc 14 has filed that. She filed it on that regular form that is on 15 the Commission's website. That should be in the Commission's 16 possession. It should have been filed electronically, so I hope 17 that that's -- that resolves that and that our permissions can 18 be granted. 19 JUDGE JORDAN: I haven't seen that entry of 20 appearance, but that's -- that's the only thing that prevented 21 the Commission from ruling on the application. And even without 22 the granting of the application for intervention, federal 23 agencies are free to participate in this action.

24 MR. BRUDER: Thank you very much, Judge.25 JUDGE JORDAN: Well, you're entirely welcome and

1	I'll look for that when I get back to my office. Thanks for
2	letting me know about that.
3	Is there anything else before we go off the
4	record and adjourn this part of the prehearing conference?
5	I'm not seeing anything. Then we can adjourn
6	this part of the prehearing conference and go off the record.
7	Thank you very much everyone.
