2	JUDGE JORDAN: The Commission is calling the cases
3	in File Nos. ER-2012-0174 and ER-2012-0175. I'm Daniel
4	Jordan. I'm the Regulatory Law Judge assigned to this
5	case. We're on the record with a Reporter, and we are
6	convening a discovery conference in these actions.
7	I'll start with entries of appearance. First, the
8	applicants, please.
9	MR. FISCHER: Let the record reflect the
10	appearance of James M. Fischer, Fischer and Doritz, P.C.,
11	101 Madison Street, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri,
12	65101, appearing in these cases on behalf of Kansas City
13	Power & Light Company and KCP&L of Greater Missouri
14	Operations Company.
15	MR. BORGMEYER: Let the record reflect the
16	appearance of John Borgmeyer for the Staff of the Missouri
17	Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City,
18	Missouri, 65101.
19	JUDGE JORDAN: For the Office of Public Counsel?
20	MR. MILLS: On behalf of the Office of Public
21	Counsel and the Public, my name is Lewis Mills. My
22	address is P.O. Box 2230, Jeff City, Missouri, 65102.
23	JUDGE JORDAN: And intervenors?
24	MR. COOPER: Dean Cooper on behalf of Southern
25	Union Company, doing business as Missouri Gas Energy. The

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1	Reporter has the other.
2	JUDGE JORDAN: Very good.
3	Anyone else to enter an appearance this morning?
4	(No response.)
5	JUDGE JORDAN: Seeing none, I'll ask the parties
6	whether there are any discovery matters to resolve this
7	morning.
8	MR. FISCHER: Not that I'm aware of, Judge. I
9	have a report on where we are on discovery, but I don't
10	know of any disputes.
11	JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. Well, can you give me your
12	report then?
13	MR. FISCHER: The information I've been given is
14	that, in the Kansas City Power & Light case, there have
15	been a total of 1,252 data requests; 1,067 have been
16	completed. There was one data request by the Staff where
17	they requested a 10-day turnaround, and the company's
18	attempted to do that, but they are, apparently, late from
19	beyond the 10 days.
20	And, then, in the GMO case, there have been 647 DR
21	issues, and 537 have been completed. There are none that
22	are late at this point.
23	So, combined, we have a total of 1,899 DRs; 85
24	percent have been completed, 1,604, and there is just that
25	one that is late.

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1	JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you.
2	Anything from the Staff?
3	MR. BORGMEYER: Well, just to say that Staff has
4	agreed to multiple extensions for data requests, but I
5	think that there hasn't been any specific conflicts that
6	I'm aware of.
7	JUDGE JORDAN: Okay.
8	Office of the Public Counsel?
9	MR. MILLS: We've had no discovery issues.
10	JUDGE JORDAN: Intervenor?
11	MR. COOPER: Nothing today, your Honor.
12	JUDGE JORDAN: All right.
13	Does anybody have anything else for me while we're
14	on the record?
15	MR. BORGMEYER: Yes, Judge. I did want to mention
16	that there I have heard about a matter relating to some
17	external auditing work papers from the from the
18	company's auditor. And I'm not sure what the details of
19	that situation are. It may be resolving itself, but
20	JUDGE JORDAN: Is that a failure to produce work
21	papers or just a request as to their content?
22	MR. BORGMEYER: I'm not sure.
23	MS. KLIETHERMES: Sarah Kliethermes for the Staff.
24	My understanding I haven't been directly
25	involved with this but I think this is an issue where

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1	there's been some agreements made and it's a matter of
2	seeing if what was agreed to comes in, that type of thing.
3	I'm not entirely familiar with the details, but we weren't
4	sure of if there was any issue with waiver, if, you know,
5	this was a matter before this discovery conference, but we
6	didn't raise it at the discovery conference.
7	MR. BORGMEYER: So, it may be a pending issue
8	rather than a going-over issue.
9	JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. Fair enough.
10	Counsel, do you know anything about that?
11	MR. FISCHER: I don't know the specifics. I know
12	the company raised an accountant privilege, which I don't
13	know if that's the one or something work papers were
14	external.
15	MS. KLIETHERMES: I believe this is what it's
16	about. To be honest, I'm not the counsel that's been
17	working on it, so I don't know the details.
18	MR. FISCHER: It hasn't been brought to our
19	attention of something that needs to be to the Commission.
20	JUDGE JORDAN: If you need enforcement, you know
21	where to find us.
22	Anything else before we go off the record?
23	(No response.)
24	JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you for your attendance
25	today.

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1	We will adjourn this conference and go off the
2	record. Thank you.
3	MR. FISCHER: Thank you.
4	(Adjournment.)
