	WHEREFORE, Complainant now requests the following relief:
1.	Order SBC to allow me to have residential service without having to disclose my Social Security Number; and
2.	Order SBC to accept a copy of my driver's license and deed to my residence as proof of my identity (as they originall agreed with Mo.PSC; and
3.	I will pay a deposit of not more than six (6) months cost base residential phone service to be held by SBC for eight (18) months.

EXHIBIT A

Complainant has made four requests for telephone service to Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SBC).

The first request was made in February 2002, and a deposit was taken by SBC. The deposit was taken by making a charge to my credit card account, thereby providing confirmation of my credit worthiness. I was given a phone number and a date for installation. My residence, which I own, is prewired for telephone service and a previous owner had telephone service.

Time passed without service being installed. I, then made a second request for service and another deposit was taken by SBC against my credit card. On both occasions, I was asked to give my Social Security Number, which I refused to provide, indicating I considered that to be an invasion of my right to privacy. I am also concerned because of rampant identity theft credit fraud. I do not owe SBC for previous telephone service.

In order to resolve this problem, I offered to provide other forms of identification and pay a larger deposit, but my offer was declined (ie., deed to residence where service was applied for). I also offered to bring my driver's license to any location in the St. Louis area for SBC's verification of my identity.

All of these offers were not acceptable to SBC. I then contacted the Missouri Public Service Commission, Maryland Heights Office, who called the St. Louis office of SBC and then told me I

could take my identification to that office. When I called the St. Louis contact person to make an appointment, I was denied an appointment rather abruptly. I also contacted Birch, Sage, and other phone companies for service, but was told SBC was the only phone company that could hook up my service, since SBC owned all of the telephone lines. These other companies indicated that they would be glad to sell me service after I was connected. I desire only residential service with no long distance service.
