ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The Missouri Public Service Commission is defining the scope of the issues in

accordance with Staff's recommendation¹ and the more definite and certain statement of

Chantel R. Muhammad² and setting the date for the evidentiary hearing on the merits of

Mr. Muhammad's complaint.³

The complaint procedure determines whether Laclede Gas Company ("Laclede")

violated a statute that the Commission has authority to enforce, or a Commission

regulation, order, or tariff:

Complaint may be made by [Mr. Muhammad] in writing, setting forth any act or thing done or omitted to be done by [Laclede] claimed to be in violation, of any provision of law, or of any rule or order or decision of the commission [.⁴]

At the evidentiary hearing, the Commission must exclude any evidence that does not tend

to prove, or tend to disprove, Mr. Muhammad's claims.⁵

Mr. Muhammad's complaint charges Laclede with unlawful disconnection. Staff cites

the Commission regulation that allows disconnection for:

(A) Nonpayment of an undisputed delinquent charge [.⁶]

But failure to pay is not cause for disconnection under provisions of Laclede's tariff⁷ setting

forth specific facts. The first two cited provisions specify bills not related to Mr. Muhammad

but related to to:

(D) . . . another customer, unless [Mr. Muhammad] received substantial benefit and use of the service;

(E) . . . a previous owner or occupant of the premises . . . except where the previous occupant remains an occupant or user [.⁸]

The third cited provision specifies a bill addressed to Mr. Muhammad that is:

(F) . . . correcting a previous underbilling, whenever [Mr. Muhammad] claims an inability to pay the corrected amount, unless [Laclede] has offered [Mr. Muhammad] a payment arrangement equal to the period of underbilling. [⁹]

As to underbilling, undercharging, and other errors, Staff cites the Commission's regulation

setting forth the procedure for correction or adjustment:

(1) For all billing errors, the utility will determine from all related and available information the probable period during which the condition causing the errors existed and shall make billing adjustments for that period as follows:

* *

(B) In the event of an undercharge, an adjustment shall be made for the entire period that the undercharge can be shown to have existed not to exceed twelve (12) monthly billing periods or four (4) quarterly billing periods, calculated from the

date of discovery, inquiry or actual notification of the utility, whichever was first [.¹⁰]

Those provisions determine the evidence admissible at the evidentiary hearing, which will convene as set forth in the ordered paragraphs below.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Commission will convene the evidentiary hearing on June 27, 2016 at the Wainwright State Office Building, 111 North 7th Street, Suite 105, St. Louis, Missouri beginning at 10:00 a.m. The assigned room meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act and any person who needs additional accommodations to participate in the pre-hearing conference shall alert the Public Service Commission before the hearing by calling the Commission's Hotline at 1-800-392-4211 (voice) or Relay Missouri at 711.

2. At the hearing, the issues shall be as described in the body of this order.
