On December 21, 2022, pursuant to 49 United States Code (USC) § 60118(d), the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) notified the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) that it granted a waiver to Roeslein Alternative Energy Services, LLC (RAES) allowing a 125 pounds per square inch gauge (psig) maximum allowable operating pressure (MAOP) for PE4710 pipe manufactured in October 2019.

The Commission issued the waiver to RAES on December 21, 2022, with an effective date of February 28, 2023. The waiver applies to approximately 8.4 miles of 6-inch diameter, PE4710, intrastate gas transmission pipeline (Pipeline) that transverses from Somerset Farm to an interconnection with the ANR Pipeline in Mercer County, Missouri.

The waiver allowed RAES to use a design factor (DF) of 0.40 instead of a DF of 0.32 for PE4710 pipe and to raise the MAOP from 100 psig to 125 psig after the completion of an eight-hour pressure test at or above 188 psig on the Pipeline.

The waiver with conditions meets 49 Code of Federal Regulations § 192.121(c)(2) and Subpart J of Part 192. Pursuant to 49 USC § 60118(d), PHMSA does not object to issuance of this waiver by the Commission for RAES' Pipeline.
