I am writing to comment on the Spire STL Pipeline Project and why it should be removed. It never should have been allowed. The pipeline is approximately 25 feet from my back property line. My husband and I did not want it on our property and we do not like it so close. It is a danger and it is a nuisance in multiple ways.

Since it was installed, a property owner to the southeast of our property, has a muddy lake every time it rains. Even slight rain will result in mud. They removed vegetation that was preventing erosion and the result is mud.

The delivery (transfer) station is noisy and has resulted in huge trucks traveling on a two-lane road that is not built for their size. They travel it at all times of the day/night. It is noisy and hazardous since the trucks speed along a 35 mph road.

The delivery (transfer) station itself is quite noisy. When it runs it is so loud. We did not know what it was when it first started operating. Our dogs go crazy from the noise and it is very disturbing if other people are over -you have to go inside and you can still hear it.

When Spire needs to do something that requires a change to the electricity, we are not notified. Instead, our electric is shutoff for however long to suit Spire. We are a relatively rural area, and a lot of the homes have wells for water. We require electricity to operate those wells, but Spire doesn't care if they inconvenience us. It is all about them.

Since Spire is able to use trucks to deliver and transfer natural gas, they should be able to do that from the site in St. Charles County, Missouri and this pipeline should be removed. It is a danger - too close to homes and a leak could result in a fireball.

They need to plant a lot of trees and other vegetation that they removed to stop the erosion issues.

Spire believes they can do whatever they want and then ask the people to pay for it. It is insane and unnecessary that this pipeline was put in. The people here were not really told the truth about the danger of it. They definitely were not told the environmental issues, such as erosion effects.

Please make Spire remove the delivery (transfer) station and pipeline they installed. They should use the line in St. Charles County.
