- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, good afternoon,
- 3 everyone, and welcome to the prehearing conference
- 4 today. This is Case No. GC-2008-0009 which is the
- 5 case of Paula Gianella versus Laclede Gas Company and
- 6 we're here today for a prehearing conference. And
- 7 we'll begin with entries of appearance beginning with
- 8 Laclede.
- 9 MR. ZUCKER: This is Rick Zucker,
- 10 Z-u-c-k-e-r, here on behalf of Laclede Gas Company,
- 11 720 Olive Street, St. Louis, Missouri 63101.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for Staff?
- MS. SHEMWELL: Lera Shemwell representing
- 14 the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission,
- 15 Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Paula Gianella is here
- on the phone representing herself; is that correct?
- MS. GIANELLA: Correct.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Very good.
- 20 Well, the reason I asked you to take part in this
- 21 prehearing conference today is just to give you-all a
- 22 chance to discuss this and maybe reach some resolution
- 23 on the overall case, but if that's not possible, I need
- 24 to have you give me an idea of how soon you want to be
- 25 able to have a hearing. And we can do that a couple

- 1 of different ways.
- 2 Sometimes the parties want to have
- 3 prefiled testimony. Other times we just have a
- 4 hearing and hear everything live at the hearing. And
- 5 the other parties can explain that a little bit more
- 6 to you later, Ms. Gianella, if they'd like to give
- 7 you that opportunity.
- 8 And the other question that needs to be
- 9 resolved is, first of all, of course, when we want to
- 10 have a hearing, if you just want to pick a date. If
- 11 you can't pick a date, I'll pick a date for you. I
- 12 assume we'll be looking at something after the
- 13 holidays, but that's up to you.
- MS. GIANELLA: Right, I go for treatment
- 15 every day so ...
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: So you want to wait for
- 17 a while on that.
- MS. SHEMWELL: We'll work with
- 19 Ms. Gianella too, to see if we can't arrange
- 20 something that's satisfactory to her.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: That would be great.
- 22 And we now have technology available to us that we
- 23 can have a -- set up an electronic link with our
- 24 office in St. Louis so that part of the hearing can
- 25 take place here in Jefferson City and then anyone who

- wants to take place -- take part in the hearing from
- 2 St. Louis can do it from St. Louis.
- 3 MS. GIANELLA: Okay. Great.
- 4 JUDGE WOODRUFF: So that makes it a little
- 5 bit better. And it's better quality than just doing it
- 6 on the phone because you can actually see each other.
- 7 MR. ZUCKER: And is that -- that on
- 8 the -- the Page Road office?
- 9 JUDGE WOODRUFF: I -- Lera is shaking her
- 10 head saying yes. I've never actually done this yet.
- 11 MS. SHEMWELL: Page Road is the only
- 12 office that I'm aware of over there, and it's easily
- 13 accessible off 270, and so I think it probably is.
- 14 They have a conference room there.
- MR. ZUCKER: Okay. That's interesting.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Mr. Zucker, as
- 17 an aside, for that other case that we have, I'll
- 18 probably set up the same arrangements for that one.
- MR. ZUCKER: Okay.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Another case entirely,
- 21 Ms. Gianella.
- MS. GIANELLA: Okay.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, what I would like
- 24 you to do, then, is to discuss this today amongst
- 25 yourselves. I'm gonna leave the room here in a moment

- 1 and we'll go off the record, but if you can give me a
- 2 proposal what you want to have done, as far as the
- 3 hearing, by a week from today, which would be the 11th.
- 4 MS. SHEMWELL: That will be fine. Thank
- 5 you, Judge.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Anything else
- 7 anyone wants to bring up while we're still on the
- 8 record?
- 9 MS. GIANELLA: I provided Lera with a
- 10 copy of a comparison between my house and a friend
- 11 of mine's house because I have talked to her about
- 12 what her bills are. I know that Laclede has done
- 13 comps in the area, but basically I live here by
- 14 myself so the comps that they have done reflect
- 15 houses that have larger families because most of
- 16 the houses around this area there are kids involved,
- 17 and I provided that to Lera.
- I also cautioned that there may be some
- 19 typos primarily because I am fatigued and I don't do
- 20 the -- I'm a little dull right now, your Honor, but
- 21 the records can be verified through the St. Louis
- 22 County Assessor's.
- 23 And what I did was I did a comparable
- 24 between the two properties. And there's a significant
- 25 difference between the square footage, and I do know

- 1 that the people, the Browns, I know that primarily
- 2 it's two individuals.
- 3 But they also sometimes take care of as
- 4 many as four grandchildren, so I think that might be
- 5 similar. But they have a larger house. They have
- 6 more room and so forth.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. I don't
- 8 need to know the details at this point, but Lera has
- 9 indicated she has that here.
- 10 MS. SHEMWELL: And I'll let Ms. Gianella
- 11 know we will make that comparison and visit about it
- 12 during the prehearing conference after we go off the
- 13 record.
- 14 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Anything from
- 15 Laclede, Mr. Zucker?
- MR. ZUCKER: No, your Honor.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, with
- 18 that, then, the on-the-record portion of this
- 19 proceeding is adjourned and we're off the record at
- 20 this point.
