- A My name is Harvey Cooper. I live in Sikeston, Missour
- Q MR. COOPER, BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND WITTIS YOUR JOB THER I?
- A lam the Executive Director of Community Sheltered Vicinshop, Incorporates
- Q CAN YOU DESCRIBE FOR US THE BUSINESS OF THE COMMUNITY SHELTERE WORKSHOP?
- Community Sheltered Workshop is one of 95 workshop cross the State of Missouri that is designed to be operated with employn ent of handicapped individuals, people with mental disabilities.

- Q AND HOW MANY PEOPLE DO YOU EMPLOY AT YOUR LOCAL FACILITY?
- A Presently we employ 140 people.
- Q AND MOST OF THOSE ARE HANDICAPPED?
- A All of those are handicapped and plus we have 22 stall member.
- AND DO YOU SELL YOUR PRODUCT TO THE NORANG A SMELTEF. IN NEW MADRID, MISSOURI?
- Yes we do. Noranda for the past 23 years has been one largest account. We do custom pallet work for them, building wood products for them to ship their product out on, their rod and their billets of aluminum 30 out or our wood that we cut for them. As an example, we're heavy into the wood products pa
- 2 IS NORANDA ONE OF YOUR LARGEST CUSTOMERS?
- Yes. Presently our budget for sales in our woodworking industry there at the workshop is around \$1,000,000 per year and Noranda is well over the 50 percent mark as far as our customer base goes so they provide at least 50 percent of the market that we send our products to.
- Q HAVE YOU LOST ANY LARGE CUSTOMERS IN RECENT 1 4/RS?
- About a year and a half to two years ago we were not it cothat Elsex Wine it.

you know so we lost a fairly substantial customer. The contract would been around \$160,000 per year that we lost and so you know with Noranda being the size that it is and with them taking up the dick on our base there for sales, there's just no comparison to what Noranda mans to our shop.

Q WOULD IT BE A PROBLEM FOR YOU IF NORANDA WI N COUT OF BUSINESS?

Well, absolutely it would be a problem. Right now the rie well over 50 percond of our sales base, probably around 30 percent of our workforce, mainly handicap, would have a real good chance of losing the rights because well wouldn't be able to you know keep the product goin with the same number people there. We'd cut back just like anyone else would.

Q MR. COOPER COULD YOU TELL US JUST A LITTLE B T OF YOUR EXPERIENCE. AT THE WORKSHOP?

Well I started with Community Shelter Workshop in 1.8.5. At that time view started doing business with Noranda just almost imm is lately and so we been doing business with them for a long time, for the 2.23 years or so.

In that timeframe we have employed anywher from 90 to 130 people.

At present we're at 140. Our people there at the work hop, being handicapped, had not been able to experience a who ellot in life that most people would in a normal sense. And to many of our icks there for the jobs

that we do for Noranda - the people have taken on the lett tudes that they wo a for Noranda rather than for Community Sheltered Wo kithop because they taken such an interest in getting the Noranda jobs out.

Our job at Community Sheltered Workshop is to rovide a place for the motor work and a safe atmosphere so they're not being it job red and hurt on the job and allow them to fulfill their self-esteem. You know it we have them to job for Noranda -- I might do that job in an hour. It rought take them the self-esteem hours to do that same job and yet we are able to work with them and so that they can produce the same product that anyone who is non-handicapped could produce and yet we don't push them to that point of a ting them go or firing them because they can't keep production up at the level that non-handicapped people can.
