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1	JUDGE WOODRUFF: We're here for a procedural
2	conference in File No. GR-2018-0229, which concerns the Gas
3	Service Rates of Empire District Gas Company. Let's begin by
4	taking entries of appearance beginning with Empire.
5	MS. CARTER: Diana Carter with Brydon,
6	Swearengen and England for The Empire District Gas Company.
7	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And for Staff?
8	MR. KEEVIL: Representing Staff Jeff Keevil, PO
9	Box 360, Jeff City, Missouri 65102.
10	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And from Public Counsel?
11	MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for the
12	Office of the Public Counsel.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Missouri School Board
14	Association?
15	MR. BROWNLEE: Richard Brownlee, Missouri School
16	Board Association.
17	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And MECG?
18	MR. WOODSMALL: David Woodsmall on behalf of
19	MECG.
20	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Renew Missouri is also a
21	party. Is anyone here for Renew Missouri?
22	MR. OPITZ: Tim Opitz for Renew Missouri. My
23	address is 409 Vandiver Drive, Building 5, Suite 205, Columbia
24	Missouri 65202.
25	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. I believe that is

everyone. Did I miss anyone? All right. 1 2 I brought you all here together today to discuss a procedural schedule to resolve this case. And I'll ask you to 3 submit a proposed procedural schedule by next Wednesday, which 4 will be November 21. Any questions or any other matters that we 5 need to take care of while we're on the record? 6 7 MS. CARTER: Judge, what are you contemplating 8 for our procedural schedule? JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, we have -- in these other 9 10 cases we've -- they've been requesting an evidentiary hearing 11 presumably on the question of an AAO. 12 MR. KEEVIL: Can I jump in there real quick? 13 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Sure. 14 MR. KEEVIL: Because I've unfortunately been 15 involved with all of those. One of them we filed a procedural 16 schedule with three rounds of testimony and a hearing sometime 17 in February, I think. The other one we have not filed anything 18 yet other than a status report because of the different postures 19 of the different companies and different -- the way that they 20 have treated the taxes and booking. 21 So Empire may be yet a third -- in fact they 2.2 will be, I know, because Empire unlike the other two, have 23 already filed tariffs to reduce the current rates due to the tax 24 cuts. Empire's in even a different situation than the other two 25 and the other two I think were looking to hopefully file a

1	procedural schedule by the end of the month, but may not that
2	depends too on what transpires there.
3	I'll just throw that out there. They haven't
4	all gone the procedural schedule hearing route yet. They may.
5	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Well, I'm certainly
6	willing to be flexible. I'm sure the Commission is as well. So
7	however you believe it will best be resolved, the Commission is
8	open to whatever may have to suggest. There's the AAO issue and
9	then there's the ADIT now, how to handle all that, so.
10	MR. KEEVIL: Is there any chance the let's
11	see, today is the 15th in terms of the proposal I mean, I
12	think we had two and a half weeks on the other ones, filing the
13	proposed schedule.
14	JUDGE WOODRUFF: If you need longer, that's
15	fine. Just tell me when you think you can do it. If you want
16	to wait until after Thanksgiving
17	MS. CARTER: Judge, is there a chance you could
18	give us a date for a status report perhaps, or no? It needs to
19	be a procedural schedule?
20	JUDGE WOODRUFF: A status report will be fine.
21	MS. CARTER: Okay.
22	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Let's make the status report
23	due next Wednesday and then you could tell me how things are
24	going.
25	MR. BROWNLEE: And by status are we assuming the

Company is going to start with just some dates and then we are 1 2 all going to respond back and forth amongst ourselves and then 3 that status report would be the proposed procedural schedule 4 next Wednesday? Is that what we are kind of thinking about or 5 not? 6 MS. CARTER: What I was thinking is no, not that 7 we'd have a procedural schedule yet, but that we could file with 8 the judge saying here's what we're looking at. Here's when we 9 think we can file the procedural schedule if a procedural 10 schedule is necessary. We don't need to keep Judge Woodruff 11 probably for this, but I would just wanted to let the parties 12 know where Empire is and how Empire is already booking things 13 for ADIT. And for part of it we may not need an AAO like some 14 of the companies are because of how Empire is already booking 15 the ADIT, the excess ADIT. 16 MR. BROWNLEE: Don't you think one way or the 17 other -- I mean, I don't mean to argue the merits, but there's 18 surely going to have to be some testimony. I mean, ultimately 19 whatever we do, the Commission is going to have to -- there's 20 gotta be some kind of record. And just because we all know something doesn't mean they do. 21 22 MR. KEEVIL: You could do it by stipulation, 23 Richard. 24 MR. BROWNLEE: Yeah. 25 MR. KEEVIL: You wouldn't have to have

1	testimony.
2	MR. BROWNLEE: Yeah and that usually would take
3	us to about June to get that worked out.
4	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hopefully not quite that long.
5	MR. BROWNLEE: Okay.
6	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, it sounds
7	like you I'm going to leave you to your negotiations here and
8	that's fine. Anything else while we're on the record?
9	MR. KEEVIL: You mentioned you said the ADIT
10	and AAO when you're speaking a moment ago, Judge?
11	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yes.
12	MR. KEEVIL: Which AAO are you talking about if
13	not the ADIT?
14	
	JUDGE WOODRUFF: The AAO I assume would apply to
15	the earnings between the time when the tax cut went into effect
16	and the Company reduced their rates, so between January and
17	October.
18	MR. KEEVIL: So you could have two AAOs?
19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: I suppose so.
20	MR. KEEVIL: One for that one, you got one from
21	the ADIT.
22	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Yeah. Okay. With that then,
23	we are off the record.
