1	JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. We are on the record. We
2	are here in Case No. HR-2018-0231 in The Matter Of The Propriety
3	Of The Rate Schedules For Steam Service of KCP&L Greater
4	Missouri Operations Company. We here today for a prehearing
5	conference or a procedural conference in these otherwise unusual
6	procedural cases.
7	My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the regulatory
8	law judge assigned to this case. And we'll begin by asking the
9	attorneys to make their entries of appearance. Start with
10	Staff.
11	MR. BERLIN: Yes, Judge. Appearing on behalf of
12	the Staff are Bob Berlin and Travis Pringle of the Commission's
13	office address.
14	JUDGE DIPPELL: And Office of Public Counsel.
15	MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for the
16	Office of Public Counsel.
17	JUDGE DIPPELL: KCP&L, GMO?
18	MR. FISCHER: On behalf of steam operations of
19	KCPL Greater Missouri Operations Company, James Fischer, 101
20	Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101.
21	JUDGE DIPPELL: Midwest Energy Consumers Group?
22	MR. WOODSMALL: David Woodsmall on behalf of
23	MECG.
24	JUDGE DIPPELL: I guess that is it. So these
25	are the tax impact cases. This one is a little more unusual

1 than the others. We have several of these cases going on at the 2 Commission right now. This one is dealing with steam service, which is not the same kind of rate entity that some of the 3 others are given that its customers are all industrial and 4 there's a fewer number of them. 5 6 So the Company filed its responses to my order 7 yesterday and I'm going to ask you guys where you see this going from here. Mr. Fischer? 8 9 MR. FISCHER: From the Company's perspective we have been talking with our customers and the facility and it's 10 11 been constructive. We would like to continue to talk to see if 12 there is a way we can resolve the matter without having a 13 hearing of any sort. I think the Company did file to recognize 14 the tax impact as our pleading showed we think there's a 15 substantial revenue deficiency and will probably end up in a 16 rate increase. We would request the Commission just continue to 17 monitor this situation. We'd like to continue to talk to Mr. 18 Woodsmall and other customer representatives if there are any to 19 try to resolve it and keep you informed. 20 JUDGE DIPPELL: Mr. Woodsmall? 21 MR. WOODSMALL: I was out in Topeka yesterday 22 and talked with some of the KCP&L representatives they. 23 are in Saint Joe today talking with some of the customers 24 directly. I agree with Mr. Fischer. I would just propose that 25 we give you a status report or something in the near future

1	wether then just letting it linger we provide some status
1	rather than just letting it linger, we provide some status
2	report. We would like to have further discussions as well
3	rather than push this to hearing which may cause an even larger
4	rate increased to be filed more immediately. We would just like
5	to help it sit for a little bit.
6	JUDGE DIPPELL: And Staff?
7	MR. BERLIN: Staff is supportive of their
8	efforts.
9	MR. POSTON: We are as well.
10	JUDGE DIPPELL: My only concern is with the
11	cumulated tax.
12	MR. WOODSMALL: EDIT.
13	JUDGE DIPPELL: Yeah. It seems like that is
14	somehow going to have to be accounted for in something.
15	MR. FISCHER: I think at some point it will be
16	reflected in our discussions and have it resolved. If you defer
17	it and it goes to the bottom of the line it is going to cause
18	the Company to need to do something sooner rather than later. I
19	think that will be part of the discussions held and how we
20	resolve it.
21	MR. WOODSMALL: I don't think absent some
22	Commission order right now the flow back of that EDIT is going
23	to be lost for customer benefits. It can be addressed at some
24	point in the future and Staff's expert may have a better idea on
25	that, but that's my understanding.

1	JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Okay. Well, the other
2	cases are kind of going with a procedural schedule set up in a
3	couple of weeks. They're going to file a procedural schedule.
4	Are you talking about something a little longer than that?
5	MR. FISCHER: Yes. From our perspective we'd
6	like about 90 days or so to continue these discussions if that's
7	acceptable to Staff and the Commission.
8	JUDGE DIPPELL: Well, in that case I will just
9	issue an order asking for Staff's update in 90 days and we will
10	take it from there I guess.
11	MR. FISCHER: That's great.
12	JUDGE DIPPELL: You are welcome to stay and talk
13	now if you want or leave and do it another day. We will go
14	ahead and conclude. We are off the record.
