ORDER SCHEDULING PREHEARING CONFERENCE
AND DIRECTING FILING

On August 24, 2007, Charter Fiberlink, LLC (Charter), filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission against CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC (CenturyTel). On September 26, 2007, CenturyTel filed its Motion to Dismiss, Answer, Affirmative Defenses and Counterclaim. On September 28, 2007, the Commission issued an order directing the Commission's Staff to investigate and make a recommendation concerning CenturyTel's defenses and counterclaim in conjunction with its investigation of Charter's complaint, and establishing a deadline of October 26, 2007, for responses to CenturyTel's defenses and counterclaim.

On October 24, 2007, Staff filed its recommendation. Staff advised the Commission that, because the complaint and counterclaim involve the interpretation of the parties' currently approved interconnection agreement, rather than a factual dispute or an alleged violation of a rule or statute, scheduling a prehearing conference would be more practicable than conducting an investigation at this time. The Commission finds Staff's recommendation to be reasonable, but does not want to deny any party the opportunity to fully respond to CenturyTel's defenses and counterclaim.

The Commission shall schedule a prehearing conference for a date that is after the deadline to respond to CenturyTel's counterclaim. It is expected that the prehearing conference will provide an opportunity for the parties to further pursue settlement discussions. The parties shall jointly file a proposed procedural schedule one week after the prehearing conference.

The Commission informs the parties that this prehearing conference is *not* an *evidentiary hearing*. Sworn testimony will not be taken and no final decision will result from this prehearing conference. However, all parties are required to be present for and arrive or phone into the prehearing at or before the scheduled starting time of 10:00 a.m. Pursuant to Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.090, "Failure to appear at a prehearing conference without previously having secured a continuance shall constitute grounds for dismissal of the parties or the party's complaint, application or other action unless good cause for the failure to appear is shown." As set out below, any party who wishes to attend by telephone will be permitted to do so.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The parties shall attend a prehearing conference to be held on November 7, 2007, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The prehearing conference will be held in Room 305 at the Commission's offices in the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri, a building that meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. 2. Any party wishing to appear by telephone shall notify the Regulatory Law Judge by calling 573-751-3966 no later than November 2, 2007

3. The parties shall jointly prepare and file a proposed procedural schedule no later than November 14, 2007.

4. This order shall become effective on October 25, 2007.
