APPLICATION OF METROPOLITAN TELECOMMUNICATIONS OF MISSOURI, INC. TO EXPAND CERTIFICATE OF BASIC LOCAL SERVICE AUTHORITY

COMES NOW Metropolitan Telecommunications of Missouri, Inc., ("Applicant" or "MetTel") pursuant to sections 392.361, 392.410, 392.420, 392.430, and 392.450 and 392.455 RSMo. and 4 CSR 240-2.060 and 4 CSR 240-3.510, and hereby applies to expand its certificate of basic local telecommunications service authority to include provision of basic local exchange telecommunications service throughout all exchanges served by incumbent local exchange carrier Windstream Missouri, Inc. in the state of Missouri.

Pursuant to Sections 392.420, 392.245.5(8) and 392.361, RSMo and 4 CSR 240-32.010(2), MetTel also seeks a waiver of certain Commission rules and statutory provisions. In support of its Application, MetTel states as follows:

1. MetTel is a Delaware Corporation authorized to do business in Missouri, Charter No. F00489757, with a copy of its Certificate of Authority attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. The nature of the Applicant's business is telecommunications. Applicant's principal place of business is 55 Water Street, Floor 32, New York, NY 10041. Its telephone number is 212-607-2000 and its toll-free customer service number is 1-877-963-8663.

2. MetTel was previously granted authority from the Commission to provide

facilities-based and resold basic local telecommunications service in the service territories of

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company L.P. d/b/a SBC Missouri; Sprint Missouri, Inc., d/b/a

Sprint; CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC,); and Spectra Communications Group, LLC, d/b/a

CenturyTel throughout the state of Missouri.

3. Both MetTel and its basic local services have been classified as competitive, in Case

No. CA-2004-0425.

- 6. By this Application, and pursuant to Section 392.450.3 RSMo, MetTel requests an expansion of its certificate of service authority to provide competitive basic local exchange services throughout all exchanges served by the incumbent local exchange carrier Windstream Missouri, Inc. in the state of Missouri. The exchanges in which MetTel seeks authority are listed in the approved tariffs of the incumbent LEC, and will be listed in Applicant's basic local service tariff. MetTel's proposed service areas will follow the respective exchange boundaries of the incumbent LEC and shall be no smaller than an exchange as required by Section 392.455(3) RSMo.
- 7. Pursuant to this Application, MetTel seeks authority to offer and provide all forms of facilities-based and resold basic local telecommunications service to customers within Missouri as defined in 386.020(4) RSMo.
- 8. Applicant continues to possess sufficient technical and managerial resources and abilities to provide basic local telecommunications service as required by Section 392.455(1) RSMo, as found by the Commission in Case No. CA-2004-0425. A listing of Applicant's principal management employees and their qualifications was attached to MetTel's Application in Case No. CA-2004-0425 and has been updated and is attached hereto as **Exhibit B.**
- 9. Applicant continues to possess the necessary financial resources and abilities to provide the services it proposes as required by Section 392.455(1), RSMo and has the necessary capital to conduct its proposed operations in Missouri, as found in Case No. CA-2008-0336. Based on the prior, recent determination, MetTel seeks a waiver of the requirement that financial data be submitted under 4 CSR 240-3.510(1)(D).

- 10. MetTel seeks continued classification as a competitive company, including classification of its expanded basic local exchange telecommunications services as competitive, pursuant to Section 392.361 and Section 392.420 RSMo and 4 CSR 240-3.510(1)(A), with the accompanying reduced regulation that accompanies such classification. Applicant believes that its proposed services will be subject to sufficient competition to justify a lesser degree of regulation and that granting this request will allow greater price and service options for telephone users. In the Commission's previous order granting certificate of service authority, the Commission classified MetTel and its services as competitive.
- 11. MetTel will offer basic local telecommunications services as a separate and distinct service in accordance with applicable law. MetTel will give consideration to equitable access for all Missourians, regardless of where they might reside or their income, to affordable telecommunications services in MetTel's proposed service areas in accordance with the law.
- 12. Applicant is willing to comply with all applicable Commission rules, except those that are waived, in providing basic local service in the expanded service area. Specifically, MetTel will file and maintain tariffs and meet applicable minimum standards established by the Commission. MetTel will make reports to and other informational filings with the Commission as required. Pursuant to Section 392.420 RSMo (see also Section 392.245.5(8)), which provides good cause for this request, Applicant requests the following statutes and regulations, which include the new "standard" waivers permitted by HB 1779, be waived for MetTel and its basic exchange service offerings:

- 13. Applicant is filing a basic local exchange services tariff with a forty-five (45) day effective date contemporaneously with this Application.
- 14. Applicant submits that the public interest will be served by Commission approval of this Application because Applicant's proposed service will create and enhance competition and expand customer service options, consistent with the legislative goals set forth in the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and Chapter 392, RSMo. Prompt approval of this Application also will expand the availability of innovative, high quality and reliable telecommunications services within the State of Missouri.
- 15. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 392.500, RSMo., as a condition of certification and competitive classification, MetTel agrees that, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission, MetTel's originating and terminating switched exchange access rates will be no greater than the lowest Commission-approved corresponding access rates in effect for each ILEC within those service area(s) in which Applicant seeks authority to provide service. Additionally, pursuant to the Commission's Report and Order in Case No. TO-99-596, MetTel agrees that if the ILEC in whose service area the Applicant is operating decreases its originating and/or terminating access service rates, the Applicant shall file an appropriate tariff amendment to reduce its

originating and/or terminating access rates within thirty (30) days of the ILEC's reduction of its

originating and/or terminating access rates in order to maintain the cap on switched access rates.

16. MetTel has no pending or final judgments or decisions against it from any state or

federal agency or court that involve customer rates or service.

17. MetTel has no annual report or assessment fees that are overdue.

WHEREFORE, Applicant MetTel, Inc. respectfully requests that the Commission grant it

an expanded certificate of service authority to provide basic local telecommunications service as

herein requested, classify Applicant and Applicant's proposed basic local services as competitive,

and grant waivers of aforesaid statutes and regulations, at the Commission's earliest convenience.
