
### THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. PowerComm Broadband, LLC is granted authority to provide video service in the franchise area of each political subdivision set forth in the application and restated above; and
2. PowerComm Broadband, LLC is granted authority to construct a video service network along, across, or on public rights-of-way for the delivery of video service to the

extent the video service provider or an affiliate did not otherwise possess a valid authorization to occupy the public rights-of-way.

3. This order shall become effective when issued, after which this case may be closed.
