GMO: What is the appropriate level of transmission revenues? (KCPL: Weisensee; Staff: Harris; MECG: Dauphinais).

2. It is MECG's understanding that the KCPL issue will be litigated at the same time as the other class cost of service / rate design issues, on October 29, 2012, and that the GMO transmission revenues issue will be litigated with the transmission tracker issue on October 24, 2012.
