7	Q.	What is your name?		
8	А.	My name is J Luebbert.		
9	Q.	Are you the same J Luebbert who sponsored the Avoided Costs section and		
10	contributed to	the Demand-Side Program Design Section used in Staff's Report in the review		
11	of Ameren Missouri's MEEIA Cycle 3 Application ("Application")?			
12	А.	Yes.		
13	Q.	What is the purpose of your Surrebuttal Testimony?		
14	А.	My surrebuttal testimony will respond to Office of the Public Counsel		
15	("OPC") with	ness Geoff Marke's Rebuttal testimony in this case regarding exclusion of		
16	opt-out customers from MEEIA programs.			
17	Q.	On pages 26 and 27 of his rebuttal testimony, Dr. Marke discusses		
18	OPC's agreement with the position that Ameren has taken regarding exclusion of opt-out			
19	customers from MEEIA programs. What is Ameren Missouri's opinion regarding exclusion			
20	of opt-out customers?			
21	А.	In response to OPC data request 2008 Ameren Missouri states,		
22 23 24 25		Ameren Missouri does not believe that opt-out customers are eligible for any MEEIA programs (including demand response) that are proposed in the MEEIA 2019-24 Plan. Customers that do not contribute financially to the costs of a MEEIA program generally		

1 2		should not have their participation subsidized by other customers, unless specifically allowed by statute (i.e., low-income customers).			
3	Further, Ameren Missouri does not consider its programs				
4 5		(specifically, its demand response programs) to be either an interruptible or curtailable rate, since those are typically offered for			
6		a variety of reasons (e.g., reliability concerns) and are not strictly tied			
7 8		to energy efficiency. Per the MEEIA statute and rule (Section 393.1075 RSMo and 4 CSR 240-20.094(7)(M), respectively), opt-out			
9		customers could still participate in a non-MEEIA interruptible or			
10 11		curtailable rate option. (Emphasis added.)			
11		(Emphasis added)			
12	Q.	Does OPC agree with the position that Ameren Missouri has taken in the			
13	response to OPC data request 2008?				
14	А.	Yes. Within his rebuttal testimony Dr. Marke goes on to state,			
15 16 17 18 19 20		OPC is of the opinion that the opt-out provision in MEEIA is categorically unfair to customers who do not have that option. Opt-out customers already benefit from MEEIA without bearing any of the costs. It would disingenuous to allow opt-out customer the ability to further benefit from MEEIA with no associated "skin in the game." ¹			
21	Q.	Does Staff agree with the positions taken by Ameren Missouri and OPC			
22	regarding opt-out customers' potential participation within MEEIA programs?				
23	А.	Not entirely. Staff agrees that none of the programs that have been proposed in			
24	the Application are designed as interruptible and curtailable rates. ² As such, Staff also agrees				
25	that the exceptions provided in Section 393.1075.10 ³ and 4 CSR 240-20.094(7)(M) do not				
26	apply to the Business Demand Response Program or any other program that was proposed				
27	within the Application. However, Staff does not believe that opt-out customers are precluded

6	А.	No. As constituted, none of the proposed programs within the application are			
7	properly designed as interruptible or curtailable rate schedules.
