NOTICE AND ORDER DIRECTING SUPPLEMENTAL PLEADING

On February 10, 2000, IDT America, Corp. (IDT or Applicant), filed its application pursuant to Section 392.300, RSMo Supp. 1999, and 4 CSR 240-2.060(5) for approval of a transaction whereby IDT would acquire certain business and residential customers of MCI WorldCom Communications, Inc. IDT also requested a waiver of 4 CSR 240-33.150 regarding customer authorization and verification requirements related to a change of service.

The application does not address two requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.060(5). First, the application does not include a statement of the impact, if any, the sale of assets will have on the tax revenues of the political subdivisions in which any structures, facilities or equipment of the companies involved in that sale are located. Second, the application does not state whether IDT has any pending or final judgments or decisions against it from any state or federal agency that involve customer service or rates. Before the Commission may decide whether to grant the application, this information must be provided.

IDT shall file a supplemental pleading to provide the described information required by 4 CSR 240-2.060(5). The pleading should be filed

within 30 days. The Commission's Staff may proceed with its review pending the supplemental pleading.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That IDT America, Corp., shall file a supplemental pleading within 30 days of the effective date of this notice and order and provide the information required under 4 CSR 240-2.060(5), in particular, a tax impact statement and a statement of pending or final judgements which involve customer service as described in this notice and order.
 - 2. That this order shall be effective on March 21, 2000.
