Warren Wood started the meetings by discussing how the legislation being considered in this session came about. He discussed the aluminum market collapsing and Noranda comprising 10% of Ameren Missouri's load. He said Ameren Missouri and Noranda came together to find a path forward to potentially bring the Noranda Smelter back to full operation while benefitting other customers.

Chris Roepe discussed Noranda's situation and the need to move ahead with a legislative approach that would benefit all customers.

The attendees then engaged in a discussion on the different elements of legislation being considered and generally how this regulatory framework would operate. Several attendees asked questions and expressed concerns which prompted discussions on how the different elements in the legislation would operate and potential changes to the bill to address concerns expressed.
