Dear Honorable Chairman and Commissioners:

I am writing notify you of the City of St. Louis' opposition to a February 12, 2014 rate case filing made with the Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC) by Noranda Aluminum, a Tennessee-based company with a smelter in New Madrid, MO. The rate case will adversely impact St. Louis City residents.

While smelters do require a great deal of electricity, Noranda has already negotiated the lowest rate of any Ameren customer, paying less for electricity than it costs to provide them with electricity. In fact, Noranda pays 60% less than the average consumer.

The claim filed by Noranda seeks to further reduce their rate by another 25 percent. This reduction would shift costs to other consumers, totaling more than a half of a billion dollars, and more than two percent per year for the next decade. If this rate shift is approved, it will cost the City of St. Louis an additional \$3 million over the 10 year rate shift request.
