I am writing about the rate increase requested by KCPL. I used to be an employee of Aquila and am now an employee of KCPL. While I like working here I am concerned about the company not being willing to hold down costs (even though it says it does) and also giving in to what ever the union wants. When KCPL bought Aquila they raised the pay and benefits of Aquila union employees up to KCPL employees even though they knew KCPL employees already had pay and benefits <u>way</u> over other local, regional and even national companies.

How can they request double digit rate increases when their <u>average</u> base pay for union members is over \$70,000 and when you add in average overtime and benefits you get way over \$100,000? And their pension plans, you won't find anyone looking to reduce those. Look at the salaries for the same positions at other utilities and you will see what I mean. (Ask them about power plant positions like Control Room Operator or the Employee Involvement (party planner) person they have at every plant.
