## Dear Commissioner Hall,

This letter is in regards to the Grain Belt Express and I know by now that numerous letters have come across your desk. I would like for you to pause for a moment , take a deep breath and really concentrate on what I'm about to convey. Pretend you are me and try to see things from my perspective. Three years ago my son and I purchased a small farm in Ralls county about 20 miles south of Hannibal, Missouri on hwy. 79. We didn't buy this to raise cattle or grow crops, this was not a business venture of any kind. We were seeking a place of solitude and beauty where my son could live and raise a family. A place where we could enjoy the wonders of nature and take care of the land so wonderfully created. This two hundred acre plot of land is our heaven on earth!

There now appears on the horizon a threat that is looming larger every day. 
