Thank you for taking a moment to hear my requests and concerns with regard to our request for the commission to grant a rehearing in the Noranda Case.

- My name is Angela Moore. I have been a nurse at Noranda for almost 16 years. My father retired from Noranda about 5 years ago, after close to 40 years of service here. Recently my daughter started to work here-so we are a 3rd generation family at Noranda. Needless to say-my family relies on Noranda, and has for as long as I can remember, for our economic future.
- 2. I am asking that you grant Noranda a rehearing in the Noranda case.
- 3. I would like to ask you to approve the rate relief compromise supported by consumer groups
- 4. Without a lower electricity rate the New Madrid smelter is in danger of shutting down like so many smelters before it.
- 5. We currently pay the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest rate of the 9 smelters left in the US. If this doesn't change hundreds of jobs are in jeopardy.
- 6. The power to save the plant is in your hands. A compromise is sitting before the commission that would provide us with the rate relief to keep the plant open while protecting other ratepayers.
