Dear Honorable Chairman and Commissioners:

I am writing in behalf of the Orscheln Industries Companies that are headquartered and located here in Missouri. This includes the Orscheln Farm & Home distribution center and numerous store locations, the Orscheln Products manufacturing locations, and the many development properties owned by Orscheln Properties Co. L.L.C.

We understand Noranda Aluminum is attempting to secure a further reduction of their electric rate here in Missouri. I use the term further reduction since Noranda is apparently already receiving a below cost rate for the power they use today at their facility.

Their request for an additional reduction of 25% in their rate is not reasonable. We are informed that if this reduction is granted to them, Ameren Missouri's other customers, including all of our businesses, will be assessed increases in our electric costs to offset this large decrease to Noranda.

We strongly object to that premise and potential penalty that we would pay in order to grant them this reduction. As the overall economy still struggles to get back on track the last thing any business needs is additional utility expense burdens applied to operations, particularly when that burden is caused by granting another business a decrease.

We respectfully request that this rate reduction sought by Noranda Aluminum be denied.
