MAWC'S MOTION FOR EXPEDITED TREATMENT AND FOR APPROVAL OF TARIFF SHEETS ON LESS THAN THIRTY DAYS' NOTICE

Comes now Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC), and, in accordance with Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(16), moves the Commission for expedited treatment of MAWC's proposed tariff sheets, filed on November 14, 2008:

- 1. On November 14, 2008 (effective November 24, 2008), the Commission issued its Order Approving Stipulations and Agreements (Commission Order) wherein the Commission rejected the proposed water and sewer service tariff sheets submitted by MAWC on March 31, 2008 (YW-2008-0588, YW-2008-0589, YW-2008-0591, YW-2008-00592, YW-2008-0593, YW-2008-0594, YS-2008-0595, YS-2008-0596 and YS-2008-00597), and authorized MAWC to file tariff sheets in compliance with the Commission Order.
- 2. Concurrently with the filing of this Motion, MAWC filed tariff sheets in order to comply with the Commission Order. These tariff sheets carried an issue date of November 14, 2008, and a proposed effective date of December 14, 2008 (30 days), and were assigned the following tracking numbers: YW-2009-0362; YW-2009-0363; YW-2009-0364; YS-2009-0365; YS-2009-0366; YS-2009-0367; YW-2009-0368; YW-2009-0369; and, YW-2009-0370. See the attached tariffs.

- 3. To show good cause for an expedited effective date pursuant to Section 393.140(11), RSMo and approval of the revised tariff sheets on less than thirty (30) days' notice, MAWC states that the tariff sheets have been filed in compliance with the Commission's Order herein and are designed to address a revenue deficiency that exists at this time.
- 4. Further, the Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement filed in this case by the parties recommended that MAWC's new rates become effective on November 28, 2008, or as soon thereafter as is reasonably practicable. MAWC believes that it is an indication that these parties believe rate relief is appropriate at this time and should not wait an additional thirty days.
- 5. The Commission has authorized the rates and terms reflected in the subject tariff sheets and there are no further procedures to be completed in this case. Granting this Motion will afford MAWC in a timely manner the rate relief which the Commission has found to be reasonable.
- 6. Accordingly, MAWC seeks the Commission's order allowing the proposed tariff sheets to go into effect for service rendered on and after November 28, 2008, or as soon thereafter as the Commission is able to take up this motion.
- 7. The subject tariff sheets and this Motion have been filed as soon as possible after the issuance of the Commission's Order in this case. MAWC has previously provided the rates contained in the subject tariff sheets to the other parties to this case for review. Both Public Service Commission Staff and the Office of Public Counsel have reviewed and accepted the rate workpapers which support the tariff sheets.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, MAWC respectfully requests the Commission to grant MAWC's Motion for Expedited Treatment and approve MAWC's proposed tariff sheets

effective on and after November 28, 2008, or as soon thereafter as the Commission is able to take up this motion.
