### APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND FOR COMPETITIVE CLASSIFICATION

COMES NOW Trans National Telecommunications, Inc. ("Applicant" or "Trans National"), by its undersigned counsel, and hereby applies pursuant to Sections 392.361, 392.420, and 392.430 RSMo 1994, 392.410, 392.450 RSMo Supp. 1998, the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, and 4 CSR 240-2.060, for authority to provide basic local telecommunications service in portions of the State of Missouri and to classify said service as competitive. In support of its verified Application, Applicant states as follows:

1. Trans National is a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas and is duly authorized to do business in Missouri. Pursuant to the relevant provisions of 4 CSR 240-2.060, documents from the Secretary of State of both Missouri and Texas are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Appendix A.

3. By this application, Applicant requests certificate of service authority to provide resold basic local exchange services to both residence and business customers throughout all exchanges currently served by Southwestern Tell Telephone Company ("SWBT"), GTE Midwest, Inc. ("GTE"), and Sprint of Missouri ("Sprint"). The specific SWBT, GTE and Sprint exchanges within which Applicant proposes to offer services are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Appendix B. Applicant's proposed service areas will follow the respective exchange boundaries of the stated incumbent LECs and shall be no smaller than an exchange as required by Section 392.455(3) RSMo Supp. 1998. Applicant may seek authorization to provide this service in exchanges served by other incumbent LECs in a subsequent proceeding.

4. Applicant plans to offer basic local service through resale arrangements with the above-specified incumbent LECs. Applicant is currently in the process of negotiating a resale agreement with SWBT and expects to file same in the near future. Should Applicant's Application be granted, Applicant plans to commence offering basic local service immediately upon receiving

Commission approval of its resale agreement(s) and related tariffs.

5. Pursuant to this Application, Applicant seeks to offer and provide basic local telecommunications service to both residential and business customers on a prepaid basis, including: basic dial tone and limited optional features currently offered by the incumbent LECs.

6. Trans National provides comprehensive customer service to its customers. Complaints may be reported by the customer via Trans National's toll free customer service number, which is 1-800-997-8757. All service is prepaid. Customer service representatives are available to assist customers Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Central Time. Trans National's customer service representatives are prepared to respond to a broad range of service matters, including inquiries regarding: (1) the types of services offered by Trans National and the rates associated with such services; (2) monthly billing statements; (3) problems or concerns pertaining to a customer's current service; and (4) general telecommunications matters.

7. Applicant intends to offer its services in accord with its tariffs. The provisions of 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)(H) require that a proposed tariff with a forty-five (45) day effective date be included with this application, and Applicant wishes to comply with this requirement. Because negotiations are not final with any of the incumbent local exchange companies in whose territory Applicant intends to provide service, the charges for interconnection and network elements, and other material provisions and terms have not been concluded, and Applicant requests the Commission to waive the provisions of this rule. Applicant intends to supply its proposed tariffs to the Commission with at least a thirty-day effective date at or near the time its interconnection agreements are approved.

8. Applicant possesses the technical and managerial expertise and experience necessary to provide the services it proposes as required by Section 392.455(1) RSMo Supp. 1998. Applicant

has demonstrated this capacity by its successful provision of prepaid local exchange service in the State of Texas since 1998. Applicant has recently received authority to offer prepaid local exchange service in the State of Tennessee and has filed for authority in Arkansas and Oklahoma. In addition, a list of Applicant's principals and their qualification is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Appendix C.

9. Applicant possesses the necessary financial qualifications to provide the services it proposes as required by Section 392.455(1) RSMo Supp. 1997 and has the necessary capital to conduct its proposed operations in Missouri. Copies of Applicant's Financial Statements are attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Appendix D.

10. Pursuant to this Application, Applicant seeks classification of its basic local telecommunications service offerings as competitive, with accompanying reduced regulation pursuant to Section 392.361 and 392.420 RSMo 1994 and 4 CSR 240-2.060(4)(F). The existing monopoly services of SWBT, GTE and Sprint will make the basic local markets Applicant seeks to enter sufficiently competitive to make a lesser degree of regulation for Applicant and its proposed services in the public interest, consistent with the legislative policies established by the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 and the recent revisions of Chapter 392 RSMo. This Commission already has approved several applications to provide resold and facilities-based basic local telecommunications services filed by new market entrants and has classified those new entrants and their services as competitive.

11. Applicant will offer basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service in accordance with Section 392.455(4) RSMo Supp. 1998. Applicant will provide equitable access for all customers in Missouri, without regard to their income or where they might reside, to affordable telecommunications services in Applicant's proposed service area in accordance with

Section 392.455(5) RSMo Supp. 1997.

12. Applicant will comply with all applicable Commission rules and regulations, except those which are specifically waived by the Commission pursuant to Applicant's request, and is willing to meet all relevant service standards including, but not limited to, quality service, billing, and tariff filing and maintenance. Consistent with the Commission's treatment of other certificated competitive local exchange telecommunications companies, and pursuant to Section 392.420, RSMo 1994, Applicant requests that, at minimum, the following statutes and regulations for Applicant and its proposed basic local service offerings be waived at this time:

The above-referenced rules and statutory provisions have been waived with regard to other competitive local and basic local exchange carriers in prior cases. These rules or statutory provisions are principally designed to apply to noncompetitive telecommunications carriers. It would be inconsistent with the goal and purpose of Section 392.530 to apply them to a competitive telecommunications carrier such as the Applicant.

13. In addition, Applicant requests a waiver of the following rule:

### 4 CSR 240-32.030(2)

### -In-state record keeping

Applicant will not have a physical presence in the State of Missouri. The Company only intends to offer prepaid local exchange service. The physical presence of the Company will be the agents with whom it contracts to allow customers to walk into retail establishment and set up and pay in advance for service. All work will be handled out of the Texas headquarters location, including customer service, order processing and billing notification. Applicant respectfully requests this additional waiver be granted.

14. Applicant is willing to comply with all applicable Commission rules and is willing to meet all relevant service standards including, but not limited to, quality of service, billing and tariff filing and maintenance.

15. Applicant submits that the public interest will be served by Commission approval of this Application because Applicant's provision of service will create and enhance competition and expand customer service options, consistent with the legislative goals set forth in the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and Chapter 392. Prompt approval of this Application also will expand the availability of innovative, high quality and reliable telecommunications services within the State of Missouri. Customers will benefit by having alternatives from which to choose and from general improvements in price features and options that are generated by competitive market pressures. In addition, Trans National customers will benefit from consolidated billing options and a single point of contact for telecommunications needs.

WHEREFORE, Applicant Trans National Telecommunications, Inc. respectfully requests that the Commission grant it a certificate of service authority to provide resold basic local telecommunications service as herein requested, classify Applicant's proposed services as competitive, and grant waivers of the aforesaid statutes and regulations, as expeditiously as possible.
