

Just as our interstate highway system gives Missourians access to crops grown in other states, developing new transmission lines to connect abundant wind resources to market will help power our nation with clean wind energy.

Please support transmission projects that are being developed to foster more wind energy production by encouraging regulatory approvals required for these projects to move forward. <u>I encourage you to write to the Missouri Public Service Commission today</u>. And, an additional way to speak up is to <u>attend one of their upcoming public hearings</u>, which are taking place on August 12 & 13 and September 3 & 4, at various locations across the state.
