ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION, SETTING PREHEARING CONFERENCE, AND DIRECTING FILING OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Phone Bank, Inc., d/b/a Phone Banc, Inc. (Phone Bank), filed an application on April 28, 2000, for a certificate of service authority to provide basic local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Missouri under 4 CSR 240-2.060. Phone Bank wishes to provide basic local telecommunications services in exchanges currently served by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT), Sprint Missouri, Inc., d/b/a Sprint, and GTE Midwest Incorporated (GTE). The Commission issued a notice directing interested parties to file applications to intervene no later than July 6, 2000.

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) filed an application to intervene on July 6, 2000. SWBT states that it has a direct interest in the Commission's decision regarding Phone Bank's application because the services which Phone Bank seeks Commission authority to provide will be offered in direct competition with SWBT if Phone Bank's application is granted. SWBT argues that its interests as a provider of basic local exchange service differ from

those of the general public, and that no other party to this proceeding will adequately protect SWBT's interest. SWBT states that granting its application to intervene is in the public interest because SWBT will bring to this proceeding its extensive expertise and experience as a telecommunications provider.

The Commission has reviewed SWBT's application to intervene and finds that it is in substantial compliance with Commission rules regarding intervention and that SWBT has an interest in this matter which is different from that of the general public. The Commission concludes that SWBT's request for intervention should be granted and that the parties should file a proposed procedural schedule. In order to assist in the development of the procedural schedule and to clarify the issues in dispute, an early prehearing conference will be scheduled. The procedural schedule shall include dates for the filing of testimony and for a hearing. If no party requests a hearing, the Commission may grant the service authority and competitive classification requested without a hearing. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2D 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Southwestern Bell Telephone Company is granted intervention in this case in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.075(4).
- 2. That an early prehearing conference shall be held on August 4, 2000, at 10:00 a.m. The prehearing conference shall be held at the Commission's offices in Jefferson City, Missouri. The prehearing conference will be held in a building that complies with the

Americans with Disabilities Act. - 3. That the parties shall file a proposed procedural schedule no later than August 4, 2000.
 - 4. That this order shall become effective on July 20, 2000.
