## ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION, SETTING PREHEARING CONFERENCE AND DIRECTING FILING OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

JATO Operating Corp. (JATO Operating) filed an application on August 12, 1999, for a certificate of service authority to provide basic local exchange and interexchange telecommunications service in the state of Missouri. JATO Operating wishes to provide basic local and interexchange telecommunications services in the exchanges currently served by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT). On August 17, the Commission issued a Notice of Applications, directing interested parties to file applications to intervene no later than September 1, with regard to the application to provide interexchange services. That same notice directed interested parties to intervene no later than September 16, regarding the application to provide basic local services.

On August 31, SWBT timely filed an application to intervene.

SWBT stated that it has a direct interest in the Commission's decision regarding JATO Operating's application because JATO Operating will be in direct competition with SWBT. SWBT states that its interest as a

provider of basic local exchange service differs from that of the general public. SWBT further states that its intervention would be in the public interest because of its extensive expertise and experience as a telecommunications provider.

The Commission has reviewed the application and finds that it is in substantial compliance with Commission rules regarding intervention and that the applicant has an interest in this matter that is different from that of the general public. The Commission concludes that the request for intervention should be granted and that the parties should file a proposed procedural schedule. In order to assist in the development of the procedural schedule and to clarify the issues in dispute, an early prehearing conference will be scheduled. The procedural schedule shall include dates for the filing of testimony and for a hearing. If no party requests a hearing, the Commission may grant the service authority and competitive classification requested without a hearing. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2D 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989).

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Southwestern Bell Telephone Company is granted intervention in this case in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.075(4).
- 2. That an early prehearing conference shall be held on October 8, 1999, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The prehearing conference shall be held at the Commission's offices on the fifth floor of the Harry S Truman State Office Building, 301 West High Street, Jefferson City,

- 3. That the parties shall file a proposed procedural schedule no later than October 22, 1999. The procedural schedule shall include dates for the filing of testimony and for a hearing.
- 4. That this order shall become effective on October 1, 1999.
