ORDER DENYING REHEARING AND DENYING MOTION
TO CORRECT REPORT AND ORDER ON REHEARING

On July 31, 1992, Missouri Public Service, a division of Utilicorp United, Inc., submitted tariffs designed to increase rates for electric service to customers in its Missouri service territory. The Commission approved a nonunanimous Stipulation and Agreement and a revenue increase of \$4,865,804 by its Report and Order of June 18, 1993. The Commission affirmed its approval in a Report and Order on Rehearing issued February 25, 1994. The Office of Public Counsel requested rehearing of that order by application dated March 7, 1994. On the same date, Missouri Public Service filed a Motion to Correct Report and Order on Rehearing.

The Public Counsel has timely filed its Application For Rehearing and stated the grounds on which the request is based as required by 4 CSR 240-2.160. According to Section 386.500 RSMo (1986) the Commission shall grant a rehearing "if in its judgment sufficient reason therefor be made to appear." Upon review of The Public Counsel's application, the Commission finds that there is insufficient reason for rehearing and the application should be denied.

Missouri Public Service has objected to language on page 12 of the Report and Order on Rehearing stating that, in this company's last rate case it

was ordered to maintain hourly schedule logs and that, "had MPS complied with that order, this issue would have been more readily resolved without conflict over the proper method of analysis." Missouri Public Service alleges that it did maintain such logs and wishes the order to be corrected to reflect that fact. However, the company makes no citation to the record where reference is made to these hourly schedule logs or to their use in analysis of transmission versus distribution lines. Accordingly, there is no evidence other than Missouri Public Service's bare allegation which would warrant a correction of the Report and Order. The Commission finds no adequate basis exists for issuing a correction of its Report and Order on Rehearing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the Application For Rehearing of this case filed by The Office of Public Counsel on March 7, 1994, is hereby denied;
2. That the Motion to Correct Report and Order on Rehearing filed by Missouri Public Service on March 7, 1994, is hereby denied; and
3. That this order shall become effective on the date hereof.
