## APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING THEREON

COMES NOW Plaintiff, the Public Service Commission of the State of Missouri, by and through its General Counsel, and pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 92, moves the Court to grant a temporary restraining order against the Defendant, Debra J. Williams, Trustee of the Future Advance Deed of Trust and Security Agreement ("Deed of Trust") granted by Osage Water Company and dated February 15, 2001, temporarily restraining the Trustee's Sale of the property secured by the Deed of Trust currently scheduled for September 13, 2002, pending final judgment and decree in this suit. The Trustee's Sale is designed to result in the transfer of all Osage Water Company assets in Camden County from Osage Water Company, a public utility company regulated by the Public Service Commission, to the highest bidder. The Public Service

Commission Law requires that no "water corporation or sewer corporation shall hereafter sell, assign, lease, transfer, mortgage, otherwise dispose or encumber the whole or any part of its franchise, works or system, necessary or useful in the performance of its duties to the public . . . without having first secured from the [Public Service Commission] an order authorizing it to do so." Section 393.190 RSMo. 2000. The Commission has not issued such an order. Immediate injunctive relief is needed to prevent irreparable harm to the Commission and Osage Water Company customers. The potential transfer of assets will interfere with the ability of the Commission to regulate the water and sewer services provided to Osage Water Company's customers. If the assets of Osage Water Company are transferred to the highest bidder, the utility service to these customers will be at risk, as the utility infrastructure could then be owned by an owner that has no authority to provide utility service to those customers. Likewise, the company with the obligation to provide the service will not have the means to do so.

Notice: this application for temporary restraining order will be presented to the Court in chambers at the following time: 9:00 on the 4 day of 500mle, 2002, or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard.
