| 2 | Q. | Please state your name and business address. |
| 3 | A. | My name is John J. Reed. I am President and Chief Executive Officer of Concentric Energy |
| 4 | | Advisors, Inc. ("Concentric") and CE Capital Advisors, Inc. ("CE Capital"), which has its |
| 5 | | headquarters at 293 Boston Post Road West, Suite 500, Marlborough, Massachusetts |
| 6 | | 01752. |
| 7 | Q. | On whose behalf are you submitting this testimony? |
| 8 | A. | I am testifying on behalf of Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren |
| 9 | | Missouri" or the "Company"). |
| 10 | Q. | Please describe your educational background and professional experience in the |
| 11 | | energy and utility industries. |
| 12 | A. | I have more than 40 years of experience in the energy industry and have worked as an |
| 13 | | executive in, and consultant and economist to, the energy industry. Over the past 30 years, |
| 14 | | I have directed the energy consulting services of Concentric, Navigant Consulting, and |
| 15 | | Reed Consulting Group. I have served as Vice Chairman and Co-CEO of the nation's |
| 16 | | largest publicly-traded consulting firm and as Corporate Economist for the nation's largest |
| 17 | | gas utility. |
| 18 | | I have provided regulatory policy and regulatory economics support to more than |
| 19 | | 100 energy and utility clients and have provided expert testimony on regulatory, economic, |
| 20 | | and financial matters on more than 200 occasions before the Federal Energy Regulatory |

Commission ("FERC"), Canadian regulatory agencies, state regulatory agencies, various state and federal courts, and arbitration panels in the United States and Canada. I have also previously appeared before the Missouri Public Service Commission (the "Commission") as an expert on regulation and ratemaking issues. I am a graduate of the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania, and previously attended the University of Kansas. My curriculum vitae, as well as a listing of my prior testimonies, is provided in Schedule JJR-D1.

Q. Please describe Concentric's activities in energy and utility engagements.

Concentric provides financial, regulatory, and economic advisory services to many energy and utility clients across North America. Our regulatory, economic, and market analysis services include utility ratemaking and regulatory advisory services, energy market assessments, market entry and exit analysis, corporate and business unit strategy development, demand forecasting, resource planning, and energy contract negotiations. Our financial advisory activities include both buy and sell side merger, acquisition and divestiture assignments, due diligence and valuation assignments, project and corporate finance services, and transaction support services. In addition, Concentric provides litigation support services on a wide range of financial and economic issues on behalf of clients throughout North America. CE Capital is a fully-registered broker-dealer securities firm specializing in merger and acquisition activities. As CEO of CE Capital, I hold several securities licenses that cover all forms of securities and investment banking activities.

II. PURPOSE OF TESTIMONY

Q. What is the purpose of your direct testimony?

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A. Ameren Missouri has filed this rate proceeding requesting that new rates for electric service
be established based upon the recovery of prudently incurred costs as well as a return on
and of its investment in plant in service and other investments reflected in the Company's
rate base.

The purpose of my direct testimony is to provide my assessment and recommendation pertaining to the reasonableness of Ameren Service Company's ("AMS") services and associated costs billed to Ameren Missouri during the test year.

III. OVERVIEW OF AMEREN MISSOURI

Q. Please provide an overview of Ameren Missouri.

A. Ameren Missouri is an operating energy company that is a subsidiary of Ameren Corporation. The Company provides energy to approximately 1.2 million electric and 130,000 natural gas customers in central and eastern Missouri. The Company's service area covers 64 counties and more than 500 communities including the greater St. Louis area.

15 Q. Please describe Ameren Corporation.

A. Ameren Corporation ("AMC") is the parent company of Ameren Missouri and consists of
AMC and all of its subsidiaries. AMC was formed in 1997 as a result of the merger of
Union Electric Company and Central Illinois Public Service Company ("CIPS"). In its
19 1997 order approving the merger of Union Electric and CIPS, the Missouri Commission
also approved the formation of AMS, which is a centralized service company that provides
various corporate support services to AMC affiliates at cost.

| 1 | | In 2003, AMC acquired Cilcorp, and its operating utility Central Illinois Light |

| 2 | | Company. AMC acquired Illinois Power Company from Dynegy in 2004. AMC's Illinois |
| 3 | | utilities merged to become Ameren Illinois Company ("AIC") in 2010. |
| 4 | | Presently, AMC's operations consist of rate regulated utilities operating in |
| 5 | | Missouri, Illinois, and in interstate commerce under the jurisdiction of the FERC. |
| 6 | Q. | Does Ameren Missouri receive services from AMC? |
| 7 | A. | No. AMC has no employees and provides no services to Ameren Missouri. |
| 8 | | IV. SERVICES PROVIDED BY AMS TO AMEREN MISSOURI |
| 9 | Q. | Please describe AMS. |
| 10 | A. | AMS is a service company that was formed to take advantage of synergies gained by |
| 11 | | eliminating redundant functions at both Ameren Missouri and CIPS subsequent to their |
| 12 | | merger that could more cost-effectively be combined into one service company. |
| 13 | Q. | What services does AMS provide to Ameren Missouri? |
| 14 | A. | AMS provides administrative support services. AMS' services include typical corporate |
| 15 | | functions such as accounting, legal, environmental, building management, information |
| 16 | | technology, etc. The preponderance of transactions pertains to corporate shared services |
| 17 | | provided by AMS to Ameren Missouri. |
| 18 | Q. | How does Ameren Missouri determine which services to procure from AMS? |
| 19 | A. | As discussed in the direct testimony of Ameren Missouri witness Ben Hasse in File No. |
| 20 | | EO-2017-0176, Ameren Missouri and AMS follow yearly, and on an ongoing basis, a Joint |
| 21 | | Planning and Procurement Policy which reflects a planning process for each budget cycle |
| 22 | | including reviews as each budget year progresses. During that process, Ameren Missouri |

determines its need for various services, the value of those services, and the level of the

| 1 | | services it will receive from AMS. I have attached the Policy to my testimony as Schedule |

| 3 | Q. | Does Ameren Missouri also have the option to self-provide or use a third-party to |
| 4 | | provide some or all of these services? |
| 5 | A. | Yes, except for those services that necessarily arise from AMC's status as a publicly traded |
| 6 | | company that owns 100% of Ameren Missouri's stock, Ameren Missouri has the option to |
| 7 | | self-provide a service, utilize the service of a non-affiliated service provider, or retain AMS |
| 8 | | to provide defined services. |
| 9 | Q. | Are the services provided by AMS to Ameren Missouri necessary and appropriate? |
| 10 | A. | Yes. The services that Ameren Missouri receives from AMS are both necessary and |
| 11 | | appropriate. The manner in which the services are provided to Ameren Missouri by AMS |
| 12 | | is consistent with how numerous other regulated utility companies obtain such services. |
| 13 | Q. | Are the services provided by AMS to Ameren Missouri governed by a Cost |
| 14 | | Allocation Manual ("CAM")? |
| 15 | A. | Yes. The manner by which AMS' services are provided and charged to Ameren Missouri |
| 16 | | is set forth in a CAM which is currently before this Commission for review and approval |
| 17 | | Among other things, the CAM: |
| 18 | | Codifies recordkeeping and access to records requirements, including documentation |
| 19 | | of affiliate transactions, and the continued provision of detailed affiliate transaction |
| 20 | | reporting for all products and services provided by AMS, not just to Ameren Missouri |
| 21 | | but to all AMC affiliates; |

• Codifies certain detailed reporting requirements;

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- Requires that all affiliate transactions be conducted under a written contract between

 Ameren Missouri and AMS;
- Requires extensive training with respect to Affiliate Transactions Rules compliance,
 and sharing of training materials with Staff prior to their use so that they may provide
 their input; and
 - Requires the formation and implementation of an Ameren Missouri CAM Team to aid
 in Ameren Missouri's compliance with the Affiliate Transactions Rules, subject to
 approved variances.

9 Q. Are service companies, such as AMS, common in the energy industry?

- A. Yes. As a result of industry mergers and acquisitions, many stand-alone, single jurisdictional energy companies have merged or been acquired. In an effort to increase efficiencies, ensure consistent practices throughout the organization, and reduce costs, the post-merger integration of common functions at an affiliated service company has been a common trend throughout the United States. Service companies similar to AMS file Form 60 annual reports with the FERC. The Form 60 report is an annual regulatory report requirement under 18 CFR 369.1 for centralized service companies. The report is designed to collect financial information from centralized service companies subject to the jurisdiction of the FERC.
- 19 Q. Have you prepared an exhibit identifying the service companies which filed a Form
 20 60 annual report, and the affiliated companies to which the service companies
 21 provided services, and the services provided?
- 22 A. Yes, I have included this information in Schedule JJR-D3.
- 23 Q. Please describe what Schedule JJR-D3 shows.

- A. Schedule JJR-D3 identifies the service companies and affiliated companies to which services are provided, as well as the services provided to the affiliated companies.

 Schedule JJR-D3 shows that 45 utility service companies filed FERC Form 60 annual reports. Reviewing these reports, the service companies provided services to 869 affiliated companies, including many regulated utilities.
- Q. Based upon your review of the scope of services offered by AMS to Ameren Missouri,
 are the services provided consistent with those of other service companies in the
 energy industry?
- 9 A. Yes. In my experience, the services provided by AMS to Ameren Missouri are consistent
 10 with those provided by other service companies to affiliated regulated utilities. Schedule
 11 JJR-D3 further supports my experience and conclusion.
- 12 Q. Based upon your experience, is the use of the shared services model prevalent today
 13 in the energy industry?
- 14 A. Yes. Based upon both my personal knowledge of the energy industry, as well as the
 15 number of Form 60 reports filed with the FERC, service companies continue to be widely
 16 used throughout the energy industry in the United States.

V. COST OF AMS' SERVICES

- 18 Q. Does AMS direct charge for its services when the service is only to one affiliate?
- 19 A. Yes, it does.

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Q. When the direct assignment of costs is not possible, are AMS' services provided to
Ameren Missouri and its other affiliated companies at the fully distributed cost of
providing those services?

A. Yes, they are (and that is true for directly charged services as well). All costs incurred by 1 AMS are either directly charged (when the cost applies only to one affiliate) or allocated 2 using a service request system. Regardless of whether the services are directly assigned or 3 allocated, the cost of the services is always priced at AMS' fully distributed cost with no 4 mark-up or profit component. As discussed in Company testimony filed in File No. 5 EO-2017-0176, a fully distributed cost study is currently being conducted to examine two 6 primary items: (a) whether a greater proportion of AMS costs can be direct charged and 7 8 (b) whether improvements can reasonably be made in the allocation factors used to charge allocated costs. 9

Q. How does CSR 240.20-015 define "fully distributed cost"?

- A. Section (1)(F) of the Code defines fully distributed cost as "a methodology that examines all costs of an enterprise in relation to all the goods and services that are produced. Fully distributed cost requires recognition of all costs incurred directly or indirectly used to produce a good or service. Costs are assigned either through a direct or allocated approach.

 Costs that cannot be directly assigned or indirectly allocated (e.g., general and administrative) must be included in the fully distributed cost calculation through a general allocation."
- Q. Are the costs of AMS' services the same as if Ameren Missouri were to self-provide the services?
- A. The services are, at worst, the same as if Ameren Missouri were to self-provide the services.

 It is more likely, however, that due to the economies of scale realized by centralizing the
 shared services at AMS, the services are provided at a cost lower than if Ameren Missouri
 were to self-provide the services on a stand-alone basis.

Q. Please explain.

- A. There are inherent efficiencies realized by consolidating common functions at one company, as opposed to requiring each operating company to individually perform each service. Given that AMS provides similar services to Ameren Missouri, AIC, and other affiliated companies, AMS is likely able to perform the required services with fewer personnel, and thus at a lower cost, than if each AMC subsidiary were to be individually fully staffed to provide all services. In other words, there are economies of scale realized by consolidating similar functions across the AMC companies.
- Q. Based upon your review of the manner by which AMS charges Ameren Missouri for
 its services, can you conclude that AMS' costs are market based?
- 11 A. Yes. AMS' services are provided at cost, without mark-up or profit, which consist
 12 primarily of the wages, salaries, and benefits of AMS employees. The wages, salaries, and
 13 benefits AMS pays and provides are market based. Therefore, it is reasonable to conclude
 14 that AMS' costs are market based.
- Does AMS participate in surveys to assess the wages, salaries, and benefits paid and provided to its employees?
- A. Yes. To ensure that the employees are provided a reasonable compensation package, the
 AMS Human Resources Department routinely benchmarks wages, salaries, and benefits
 against local, regional, and national companies. Its goal is to provide a total compensation
 package that is reflective of the market. Therefore, employees of AMC subsidiaries receive
 market-based wages, salaries, and benefits. Ameren witness Kelly Hasenfratz will discuss
 in greater detail how the Company establishes market-based compensation and benefits in
 her testimony filed in this matter.

- Q. Does Ameren Missouri also utilize benchmarking to assess the reasonableness of
 AMS' charges as well as its total operating costs?
- A. Yes. The Company appropriately periodically participates in and reviews the results of benchmarking studies to assess AMS' costs, as well as Ameren Missouri's overall operating expenses.
- Q. What additional steps has Ameren Missouri taken to ensure the reasonableness of the
 cost of services provided by AMS to its operating companies?
- A. Ameren Missouri has formed a CAM team and meets extensive reporting and recordkeeping requirements, going well beyond existing legislative and regulatory requirements, to continually oversee the dealings between AMS and the operating companies. In my experience, Ameren Missouri is going beyond typical practices in overseeing such dealings, including the use of a dedicated team of employees to oversee CAM compliance, as well as with its reporting activities to monitor and enforce compliance with the requirements set forth in the CAM.
- Do you believe that Ameren Missouri would be able to receive the services provided by AMS from an unaffiliated company at a lower cost?
- A. AMS follows well-established and well-designed procurement policies and No. 17 procedures that provide for solicitation of competitive bids when appropriate so that it is 18 obtaining qualified service providers, and other goods it needs to provide its services, at 19 reasonable, market-based prices. Given that AMS provides its services to Ameren 20 Missouri at cost, and that it benchmarks its wages, salaries, and benefits to the market, I do 21 not believe that Ameren Missouri could receive its services at a lower cost from a non-22 affiliated service provider. 23

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| 1 | Q. | Can you provide examples of services that AMS has outsourced, on behalf of Ameren |

| 2 | | Missouri, to a non-affiliated service provider? |
| 3 | A. | Yes. Examples of services outsourced by AMS, on behalf of Ameren Missouri, include |
| 4 | | lock box services, printing and distribution of customer bills, certain vegetation |
| 5 | | management services, and janitorial services. |
| 6 | | VI. HISTORICAL COST ANALYSIS |
| 7 | Q. | Have you prepared an analysis of how Ameren Missouri's customers have benefited |
| 8 | | from the formation of AMS? |
| 9 | A. | Yes. An analysis of Union Electric's administrative and general ("A&G") expense levels |
| 10 | | from 1999 to 2018 was prepared to determine if its customers have benefited from the |
| 11 | | formation of AMS concurrent with the merger with CIPS, CILCO and IP. In 2018, 96% |
| 12 | | of the dollars allocated to the Ameren Missouri electric distribution business from AMS |
| 13 | | were booked to administrative and general expenses. |
| 14 | Q. | Please explain the analysis. |
| 15 | A. | Starting with data from 1990, the reported A&G expense levels were collected as reported |
| 16 | | in FERC Form 1s. As previously mentioned, UE & CIPS merged in 1997. From that point |
| 17 | | forward, the historical actual expense levels were escalated using the gross domestic |
| 18 | | product implicit price deflator for each year through 2018. |
| 19 | | The same analysis was performed for the acquisition of CILCO in 2003 and Illinois |
| 20 | | Power in 2004. |

As shown in Schedule JJR-D4, the A&G cost levels for the merged companies are

consistently lower than the sum of the individual stand-alone operating companies'

escalated A&G expense levels. This indicates that the merged companies, including AMS' 1 allocated costs, are lower than they would likely have been absent the mergers. 2 3 Q. Have you also performed an assessment of Ameren Missouri's costs compared to those of similar utilities? 4 A. Yes. I compared Ameren Missouri's total non-fuel operations and maintenance ("O&M") 5 expense and administrative and general ("A&G") expense against three peer groups: 6 1. National Electric Utilities with regulated generation; 7 8 2. Midwest Electric Utilities with regulated generation; and 3. National Electric Utilities with regulated generation and 500,000 to 2,000,000 9 customers. 10 Q. What years did the benchmarking analyses review? 11 The five most recent years for which data were available (i.e., 2014-2018) were used to A. 12 perform the analyses. 13 Q. What was the source of the data used to perform the benchmarking analyses? 14 The analysis utilized data obtained from the S&P Global Market Intelligence platform. A. 15 The source of the data was the annual FERC Form 1 filings made by electric utilities. 16 Q. Did you make any adjustments to the source data? 17 A. No. 18 19 Q. How did you normalize the benchmarking analyses to account for differences in the size of the utilities? 20 To normalize issues related to the size of the companies in the comparison, all costs were A. 21

evaluated on a per customer basis.

- 1 Q. How many companies were included in electric utilities with regulated generation group?
- 3 A. There were 52 utilities including Ameren Missouri.
- 4 Q. How did Ameren Missouri compare to its peers when reviewing total non-fuel O&M

 5 cost per customer of the national electric utilities with regulated generation peer

 6 group?
- A. As shown on Schedule JJR-D5, Ameren Missouri has had below (i.e., better than) the national average non-fuel O&M costs in every year of the analysis. Over the five-year period, Ameren Missouri's costs have also increased at about one half of the rate that national average costs grew.
- 11 Q. How did Ameren Missouri compare to its peers when reviewing just the A&G portion 12 of these O&M expenses on a per customer basis?
- A. As shown on Schedule JJR-D6, out of the 52 companies in the peer group, Ameren Missouri's A&G expense per customer has shown a dramatic improvement on both an absolute and relative basis over the past five years. In 2014, Ameren Missouri's A&G cost per customer was 4.5% above the national average, but by 2018 they were 18.5% below the national average.
- 18 Q. Does this significant improvement come as a surprise to you?
- 19 A. No, it does not. At the end of 2012, Ameren Services formed a new Continuous
 20 Improvement Integration group that focused on identifying opportunities to reduce costs,
 21 improve productivity, improve reliability, improve customer satisfaction, or increase
 22 revenue across Ameren. The department leverages the results of benchmarking studies, as

| 1 | | well as other techniques to help identify potential improvement projects while reviewing |
|----|----|---|
| 2 | | the services and costs of the Ameren Services Business and Corporate Services group. |
| 3 | Q. | Is it possible that these results are biased by the inclusion of higher-cost utilities on |
| 4 | | the east and west coasts, as opposed to Midwestern utilities? |
| 5 | A. | No, in fact Ameren Missouri's costs are even more competitive when compared to Midwest |
| 6 | | utilities. As shown on Schedule JJR-D7, Ameren Missouri posted results that were 25% |
| 7 | | below the average for Midwest utilities for total non-fuel O&M costs in 2018. On this |
| 8 | | basis of comparison, Ameren Missouri is a top performer. |
| 9 | Q. | How did Ameren Missouri compare to its Midwest peers when reviewing A&G |
| 10 | | expense per customer? |
| 11 | A. | As shown on Schedule JJR-D8, Ameren Missouri's A&G cost per customer was more than |
| 12 | | 28% below the regional average in 2018, and its performance gap over its peers had been |
| 13 | | widening over the past five years. Again, this shows very substantial benefits from AMS' |
| 14 | | Continuous Improvement Plan and shows a high level of productivity gains over that period |
| 15 | | of time. |
| 16 | Q. | When the comparisons are limited to the larger utilities, which presumably have |
| 17 | | economies of scale as AMS has been able to achieve, how does Ameren Missouri |
| 18 | | compare to the national averages? |
| 19 | A. | As shown on Schedule JJR-D9, Ameren Missouri achieved slightly below-average cost |
| 20 | | levels for total non-fuel O&M in each of the last three years. Even when compared to the |
| 21 | | smaller subset of 21 other larger utilities, Ameren Missouri is performing well. |
| 22 | Q. | When compared to the larger companies, how did Ameren Missouri look for just the |
| | | |

A&G portion of O&M expense?

- A. As shown on Schedule JJR-D10, Ameren Missouri improved its A&G cost per customer in each year examined, while the peer group average increased year-over-year in three of the four year-over-year periods. In 2018, Ameren Missouri's A&G cost per customer was at the peer group average. This improvement again shows the focus that AMS has had on continuous improvement.
- 6 Q. What can be concluded from the results of this analysis?
- A. As a result of the mergers of Union Electric, CIPS, CILCO, and IP, the Company has been 7 8 able to drive down costs of the business. The source of reduced costs is from the consolidation of common corporate and A&G functions which now reside at AMS. These 9 savings result from the elimination of duplicative positions (e.g., a CEO and CFO and 10 Treasurer at each operating company, multiple CIOs, multiple General Counsels, etc.), as 11 well as economies of scale attributable to the provisioning of services by a smaller number 12 of employees than the four individual companies could have achieved. In addition, AMS 13 and Ameren Missouri have had a successful continuous improvement campaign over the 14 past six years that has brought Ameren Missouri's largest measure of cost, Total Non-Fuel 15 16 O&M per customer, down to well below the peer group average levels for all three of the peer groups I have examined. These campaigns have delivered significant savings for 17 customers, while maintaining compensation at competitive levels for employees working 18 19 at AMC subsidiaries.
- Q. Based upon your review of AMS and the services that it provides to its affiliated companies, what are your observations and conclusions?
- 22 A. My observations and conclusions are as follows:

- The use of a shared services organizations, such as AMS, is reasonable and consistent with utility industry practices;
- The scope of services offered by AMS to its affiliated companies is consistent with other utility shared services companies with which I am familiar;
- Customers of Ameren Missouri have benefited from the existence of, and services
 provided by, AMS.
- 7 Q. Does this conclude your direct testimony?
- 8 A. Yes, it does.

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1.0 Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this document is to establish the procedure used by Ameren Missouri for planning for and purchasing products and services from Ameren Services Company (AMS) in an efficient process.

This process is designed to allow Ameren Missouri to determine its need for, the nature of, and the value of the products and services offered by AMS. This process contemplates that Ameren Missouri will analyze and evaluate practical alternatives, if any, including performing the service or developing the product within Ameren Missouri, before Ameren Missouri makes commitments to purchase AMS products and services from AMS. This procedure allows Ameren Missouri to explore additional opportunities for obtaining the products or services it needs, and to increase the value of the products and services AMS provides to Ameren Missouri by either reducing the cost or increasing the service level.

1.2 It is understood that Ameren Missouri is responsible to perform adequate review and evaluation to support its decision to procure specific AMS products and services for the current year as well as the following budget year. It is understood that Ameren Missouri is responsible to ensure AMS provides all necessary information to facilitate a review of the products, services, and billings received from AMS, in order to determine whether Ameren Missouri should dispute or question AMS charges.

2.0 Scope

- 2.1 This procedure applies to all expenditures made by Ameren Missouri for AMS products and services, whether charged to balance sheet or income statement accounts.
- 2.2 This procedure does not apply to transactions under the Money Pool Agreement, under the Tax Allocation Agreement, or to products or services purchased by AMS as agent for Ameren Missouri on Ameren Missouri's behalf.
- 2.3 This procedure applies to current year AMS expenditures charged to Ameren Missouri and to development of the annual budget of AMS expenditures charged to Ameren Missouri for the following year.

3.0 AMS Joint Planning and Procurement Process

- 3.1 AMS planning and procurement is done on an annual basis, beginning no later than the end of September, so that it may be completed prior to the final Ameren Missouri board meeting of the year, normally held in December.
- 3.2 An initial comprehensive joint planning and procurement meeting is held between representatives of Ameren Missouri and AMS.

- 3.2.1 The President of Ameren Missouri, the Sr. Vice President Customer and Power Operations, the Sr. Vice President and Chief Nuclear Officer, and the Vice President External Affairs and Communications will ensure that they have obtained the views of employees within their organizations as necessary to properly evaluate the products and services available from AMS.
- 3.2.2 AMS Officers (Vice President or Sr. Vice President) representing each AMS organization providing products or services to Ameren Missouri will ensure that they have obtained information from employees in their organizations as necessary to properly provide Ameren Missouri with relevant information regarding the products and services available from AMS.
- 3.2.3 By a deadline to be determined by Ameren Missouri each year, AMS will provide to Ameren Missouri detailed information for Ameren Missouri to review in advance of the initial comprehensive planning and procurement meeting. This deadline shall be far enough in advance of the meeting to allow for in-depth review by Ameren Missouri leaders and for broader dissemination and in-depth review by Ameren Missouri employees at lower levels of the Company. The information provided by AMS shall include:
 - 3.2.3.1 Descriptions of the individual services and products AMS is willing to provide Ameren Missouri, with details defining what is included in the product or service,
 - 3.2.3.2 AMS' assessment of opportunities for Ameren Missouri to consider alternatives for obtaining the product or service or to increase the value derived from each product and service to Ameren Missouri by reducing the cost or increasing the service level.
 - 3.2.3.3 Projected aggregate annual AMS costs related to its products and services provided to Ameren Missouri, including year-over-year comparisons,
 - 3.2.3.4 Projected annual costs for each AMS product and service offered, including year-over-year actual historical costs comparisons.
 - 3.2.3.4 Records of AMS' exercise of its authority as agent for Ameren Missouri during the prior year.
 - 3.2.3.5 Any additional information requested by Ameren Missouri from AMS needed to prepare for the initial comprehensive planning and procurement meeting. Ameren Missouri and AMS are expected to document and communicate their current positions regarding AMS transactions at the time any material issue/matter develops and not wait until this annual initial comprehensive planning and procurement meeting.

- 3.2.4 Ameren Missouri will assign company resources as necessary to review the detailed information in advance of the initial comprehensive planning and procurement meeting, and ensure that:
 - 3.2.4.1 Ameren Missouri understands the full nature of the products and services that AMS offers to Ameren Missouri.
 - 3.2.4.2 Ameren Missouri evaluates the nature and extent of the products and services it will receive for the coming year.
 - 3.2.4.3 Ameren Missouri evaluates practical alternatives, if any, such as providing them within Ameren Missouri or outsourcing them to third parties other than AMS, to determine if such actions would increase the value derived from the products and services.
 - 3.2.4.4 Ameren Missouri assesses and provides feedback to AMS on opportunities for AMS to increase the value of products and services it is willing to provide to Ameren Missouri, either by reducing costs or increasing service levels.
 - 3.2.4.5 Ameren Missouri assesses and provides feedback to AMS on opportunities for AMS to provide value to Ameren Missouri and other Ameren affiliates by providing new or additional products and services needed by Ameren Missouri, at a lower cost or with a higher service level than Ameren Missouri could otherwise do on its own.
 - 3.2.4.6 Ameren Missouri assesses and provides feedback to AMS regarding the nature and extent of AMS' historical exercise of its authority as Ameren Missouri's agent and provides instructions with respect to any limits on such authority or consultation required by AMS with Ameren Missouri with respect to exercise of such authority during the upcoming year.
- 3.2.5 If the first meeting is not conclusive regarding the products, services, and price terms between AMS and Ameren Missouri, follow-up actions will be agreed to by AMS and Ameren Missouri, which may include additional meetings of the appropriate Ameren Missouri and AMS representatives.
- 3.3 Once Ameren Missouri agrees to the purchase of specific AMS products and/or services, Ameren Missouri will adjust its budgets to reflect the results of decisions made in this joint planning and procurement process and ensure that appropriate parties enter these results in the budget system before required deadlines.

3.4 Ameren Missouri will ensure that the individual products and services that AMS is to provide to Ameren Missouri are documented contemporaneously and also reflected in Ameren Missouri's next CAM filing.

4.0 Oversight/Approval Process

4.1 Ameren Missouri understands its responsibility to ensure payments to AMS are consistent with the products and services approved by Ameren Missouri. In order to support payments to AMS, Ameren Missouri will establish a monitoring process documenting the receipt of the specified product and/or service from AMS, as agreed to with Ameren Missouri, as well as Ameren Missouri's level of satisfaction with the received product or service as compared to the specified conditions for the received product or service outlined in the Ameren Missouri – AMS General Services Agreement, and will establish a monitoring process for AMS' exercise of agency authority on Ameren Missouri's behalf. Ameren Missouri shall ensure that its agreement with AMS includes a billing format that facilitates the Ameren Missouri approval process.

5.0 Internal Audit

5.1 Ameren Missouri shall initially conduct annual audits to assess the level of compliance with this procedure and to identify corrective actions, if any, necessary to ensure ongoing compliance and satisfaction of Ameren Missouri's stated responsibilities. After three years and upon a showing of a high level of compliance and responsibility satisfaction, these audits may be conducted not less than once every four years.







National Electric Utilities With Regulated Generation







Midwest Electric Utilities With Regulated Generation





Midwest Electric Utilities With Regulated Generation




