**ORDER GRANTING LEAVE TO FILE CORRECTED POST-HEARING**  
**BRIEF OUT OF TIME**

On April 23, 2007, the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers (MIEC) filed a motion asking leave to file a corrected post-hearing brief out of time. The procedural schedule required the parties to file post-hearing briefs no later than Friday, April 20. MIEC filed its brief in a timely fashion, but later discovered that it had filed an incorrect version of that brief. It filed a corrected version of its brief on April 23, along with its motion asking leave to do so.

MIEC's motion is reasonable and it will be granted. With the corrected brief having been filed, MIEC now has two briefs on file, the first of which is obviously incorrect, in that its title page proclaims it to be AmerenUE's Post Hearing Brief. To avoid confusing the record, the Commission will order its data center to remove the first-filed incorrect brief from the record.

**IT IS ORDERED THAT:**

1. The Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers is granted leave to file a corrected post-hearing brief.

2. The Commission's Data Center shall remove the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers' first-filed incorrect brief from the Commission's EFIS filing system. The incorrect brief that shall be removed is item number 799 in the EFIS docket for this case.

3. This order shall become effective on April 24, 2007.
