

ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF

On March 9, 1999, Chariton Telephone Company (Chariton) filed a Second Revised Sheet No. 14, to replace the First Revised Sheet No. 14, for all Missouri exchanges in its P.S.C. Mo. tariff No. 2. The revised sheet has an issuance date of March 10, 1999, and an effective date of April 9, 1999.

Motions to suspend the tariff and applications to intervene were filed by the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) on April 1, 1999. The Staff considers it inappropriate to tariff rates for the termination of intra-Major Trading Area (MTA) Commercial Mobile Radio Service (CMRS) originated traffic without first determining if the proposed rates meet the requirements of the Act. Staff recommends the filing be suspended and set for hearing to determine the appropriateness of applying tariffed access rates to intra-MTA CMRS-originated traffic.

The Commission has reviewed the tariff filing and Staff's motion to suspend, and finds it is appropriate to suspend the tariff sheets for

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120 days to give the Staff and the company an opportunity to address Staff's concerns. The Commission also finds that there are questions of fact and of compliance with the applicable statutes that need to be resolved before the Commission can approve the proposed tariff sheets in this case, and a hearing may be necessary to resolve these issues. The proposed tariff sheets will be suspended for a period of one hundred twenty days beyond the effective date of April 9, 1999, to August 12, 1999, or until otherwise ordered by this Commission. The Commission finds that interested parties should be given notice and an opportunity to intervene. The Commission will schedule an early prehearing conference, and set a date for the parties to offer a procedural schedule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the effective date of the tariff sheets, submitted on March 9, 1999, by Chariton Telephone Company is suspended to August 12, 1999, or until otherwise ordered by this Commission:

P.S.C. Mo.-No. 2

2nd Revised Sheet No. 14, Replacing 1st Revised Sheet No. 14 for all Missouri exchanges

2. That the Records Department of the Missouri Public Service Commission is directed to give notice to each certificated telecommunications carrier in the state of Missouri.

3. That any proper person wishing to intervene in this matter shall file an application to do so with the Secretary of the Missouri Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City,

Missouri 65102, and a copy served on Chariton Telephone Company, all intervenors, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, and the Office of the Public Counsel. Applications to intervene shall be filed no later than April 28, 1999.


4. That the Commission will conduct an early prehearing conference on April 29, 1999, at 10:00 a.m., in the Commission's offices on the fifth floor of the Harry S Truman State Office Building, 301 West High Street, Jefferson City, Missouri.

5. That anyone wishing to attend the prehearing conference who has special needs as addressed by the Americans with Disabilities Act should contact the Missouri Public Service Commission at least ten (10) days before the prehearing or hearing at one of the following numbers: Consumer Services Hotline 1-800-392-4211 or TDD Hotline 1-800-829-7541.

6. That the parties shall file a proposed procedural schedule no later than April 19, 1999.

7. That this order shall become effective on April 8, 1999.
