## **ORDER AND NOTICE**

MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI) filed a Petition on September 29, 1998, requesting that the Commission require Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) to implement intraLATA presubscription no later than February 8, 1999. MCI states that the Commission has authority to make such an order under Section 271 of the 1996 Federal Telecommunications Act. On October 5, 1998, the Mid Missouri Group¹ filed a Motion to participate without intervention. On October 9, 1998, SWBT filed a statement of opposition to the petition.

The Commission determines that proper persons should be allowed an opportunity to file an application to intervene. Applications to intervene shall be filed with the Secretary of the Missouri Public Service Commission no later than 30 days from the issuance of this order. Copies of the application to intervene should be sent to all parties of record and the Public Counsel. In addition, the Commission's Records Department should send a copy of this order to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies in Missouri.

The requirement of a hearing is met when an opportunity to be heard has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2D 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). In the event no hearing is requested, the Commission may allow the applicant to submit evidence by verified application and attachments.

### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Records Department of the Commission shall send notice to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies in Missouri.
- 2. That any party wishing to request a hearing or to participate without intervention in this matter shall file an application no later than November 13, 1998, with:
