# ORDER SETTING SUPPLEMENTAL PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND OTHER PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

Issue Date: October 24, 2018 Effective Date: October 24, 2018

On October 17, 2018, Grain Belt Express Clean Line LLC, on behalf of itself and other parties<sup>1</sup>, filed a proposed remand procedural schedule. The Commission will adopt the proposed schedule, with some revisions to accommodate the Commission's schedule, and will order additional procedural requirements. All provisions in the previously-approved procedural schedule that do not conflict with this supplemental procedural schedule shall remain in full force and effect.

#### THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The following supplemental procedural schedule is established:

- 2. The evidentiary hearing is scheduled for December 18-19, 2018, beginning at 9:00 a.m. The hearing will be held in Room 310 of the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri. The hearing will be held in a building that meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. Any person requiring additional accommodations to participate in the hearing shall call the Missouri Public Service Commission's Hotline at 800-392-4211 (voice) or Relay Missouri at 711 before the hearing.
- 3. The parties shall comply with the following additional procedural requirements:
  - A. Any supplemental testimony prepared and filed by the parties shall comply with the Commission's rules regarding direct, rebuttal, and surrebuttal testimony as set forth in Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.130(7).
  - B. The position on an issue taken by a party in the course of this proceeding prior to the Commission's Report and Order of August 16, 2017, will be considered to be the position of that party in these remand proceedings unless expressly waived by such party.
  - C. For data requests served after October 24, 2018, the response time for all data requests shall be 10 calendar days to provide the requested information, and 5 business days to object or notify that

- more than 10 calendar days will be needed to provide the requested information. Data requests sent after 5:00 p.m. will be considered served on the next business day.
- D. For data requests served after December 3, 2018, the response time for all data requests shall be 5 calendar days to provide the requested information, and 3 business days to object or notify that more than 5 calendar days will be needed to provide the requested information.
- E. Each party shall file a simple and concise statement summarizing its position on each disputed issue. Position Statements shall track the list of issues. Any position statement shall set forth any order requested, cite any law authorizing that relief, and allege facts relevant under the law with citations to any pre-filed testimony in support.
- F. Exhibit numbers are assigned in the same manner as the previous evidentiary hearing. At the supplemental evidentiary hearing, parties shall number exhibits beginning with the next unused number from their assigned number block.

If any party requires additional exhibit numbers, it may add a 1 to the beginning of its assigned numbers. For example, if Grain Belt Express has exhibits in addition to exhibit number 199, its next exhibit numbers would be 1100, 1101, 1102, etc.

- G. Each party shall prepare a list of its pre-filed, pre-marked exhibits and submit a copy of that list to every other party and to the regulatory law judge no later than December 14, 2018. The lists shall not be filed in the EFIS case file. Exhibits that may be offered during cross-examination, but which have not been pre-filed, need not be included on the list. However, when those documents are offered during the hearing, they will be assigned a number from that party's number group.
- 4. All other provisions of the Commission's *Order Setting Procedural Schedule* and *Other Procedural Requirements* issued on October 19, 2016, that do not conflict with this supplemental procedural schedule order shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
  - 5. This order shall be effective when issued.
