ORDER APPROVING TARIFFS

On June 19, 1997, the Commission issued an order granting a certificate of convenience and necessity for Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL) to serve areas outside its current service territory as the result of a sale of certain assets to the City of Independence, Missouri, and to modify the boundaries of its service territory. As part of that order, KCPL was instructed to file tariffs in accordance with the Commission's findings and including a concise description of the newly defined service territory and the transmission line corridors reflected in the new certificate.

On October 29, 1997 KCPL filed an original set of tariff sheets designed to achieve compliance with the Commission's order. The effective date of these tariffs, originally November 28 1997, was extended by KCPL to January 30, 1998 by letter filed November 10, 1997. On January 16, 1998, KCPL filed substitute tariff sheets to correct various errors at the request of the Staff. These substitute tariffs also bear an effective date of January 30, 1998.

On January 20, 1998 the Staff of the Commission filed its recommendation. In that recommendation the Staff states that it has reviewed the proposed substitute tariffs and found them to be in compliance with the Commission's order of June 19, 1997. The Staff states that the tariffs contain a description of KCPL's newly defined service territory in Jackson County together with a concise description of that service territory and a description of the boundaries of certain facilities served by KCPL outside its current territory.

The Commission has reviewed the proposed tariffs and Staff recommendation and found the tariffs to be in the public interest and in full compliance with the Commission's order of June 19, 1997. The Commission will approve the proposed tariffs for service on or after January 30, 1998.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the following substitute tariffs, filed January 16, 1998 by Kansas City Power & Light Company, are hereby approved for service on or after January 30, 1998:
