ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Telmex USA, L.L.C. (Telmex USA) applied to the Public Service Commission on January 24, 2001, for a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.440, RSMo 2000. Telmex USA asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company, and to waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. Telmex USA is a Delaware limited liability company with its principal office located at 9444 Farnham St., Suite 200, San Diego, California 92123.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications for Intrastate Certificates of Service Authority and Opportunity to Intervene on January 30, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by February 14. No requests to intervene were filed. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has

been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence.² Since no one has asked permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the application.

Telmex USA filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on March 21. The tariff's original effective date was March 12, but Telmex USA subsequently extended the effective date of the tariff until April 9. Telmex USA's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies Telmex USA as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. In its Memorandum filed on March 27, 2001, the Staff of the Commission recommended that the Commission grant Telmex USA a certificate of service authority, competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff, as amended, to become effective on April 9.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange telecommunications market is in the public interest and that Telmex USA should be granted a certificate of service authority. The Commission finds that the services Telmex USA proposes to offer are competitive and that Telmex USA should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that Telmex USA's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on January 24 should be approved, as amended, to become effective on April 9.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Telmex USA, L.L.C. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.
- 2. That Telmex USA, L.L.C. is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:

3. That the tariff filed by Telmex USA, L.L.C. on January 24, 2001, under tariff number 200100774, is approved, as amended, to become effective on April 9, 2001. The tariff approved is:


