ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

On September 20, 1990, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWB) submitted tariff sheets for Commission approval designed to establish intrastate intraLATA Common Line 800 Service and the rates, rules and regulations therefor. The proposed service eliminates the need for a special WATS access line, and is similar to an existing service offered by AT&T.

On October 15, 1990, MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI) moved to suspend SWB's proposed tariff. Following SWB's extension of the tariffs' effective date to November 24, 1990, Staff, MCI and SWB representatives met to resolve MCI's objections and to review SWB's incremental cost study submitted in support of its tariff. As a result, MCI withdrew its Motion To Suspend and, on November 15, 1990, Staff recommended that the Commission approve SWB's proposed tariff for service rendered on and after November 24, 1990.

The Commission has considered the proposed tariff and finds that it is reasonable, that the rates proposed therein will recover SWB's cost to provide the service, and that it should be effective for service rendered on and after November 24, 1990.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Tariff P.S.C. Mo. No. 27 of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company is hereby approved to become effective on November 24, 1990.

2. That this Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
