ORDER DIRECTING FILING

On May 24, 2001, the Intervenor Cities of Winchester and Maryland Heights, the City of Chesterfield, the City of St. Ann, and the Cities and Villages of Ballwin, Bel-Nor, Bel-Ridge, Bella Vista, Bellerive, Bellefontaine Neighbors, Breckenridge Hills, Clayton, Cool Valley, Crestwood, Des Peres, Green Park, Hazelwood, Manchester, Maplewood, Normandy, Pasadena Hills, Pine Lawn, Richmond Heights, Riverview, Rock Hill, Town and Country, University City, Velda City, and Wildwood jointly moved to extend the due date for a proposed procedural schedule herein to September 30, 2001. In support of this motion, the Intervenor Cities state that negotiations with Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC) are continuing, that progress is being made, and that a settlement will likely result.

On May 30, 2001, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed its response to the joint motion of the Intervenor Cities, stating that it had no objection to that motion. Also on May 30, the Office of the Public Counsel filed its response, likewise advising the Commission that it had no objection to the motion. MAWC has not filed a response.

There being no objection to the motion, and the time for filing such having expired, the motion shall be granted.



IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- That the Intervenors' Motion for Extension of Time to File Procedural Schedule, filed on May 24, 2001, is granted.
- 2. That parties shall file a joint proposed procedural schedule no later than September 30, 2001.
 - 3. That this order shall become effective on June 24, 2001.
