ORDER CANCELING SERVICE AUTHORITY

In November 1992, December 1992, and July 1993, respectively, the Commission granted Certificates of Service Authority to provide private pay telephone service to Ira Rubin/ Diamond Communications, Global Hospitality, Inc., and Exchange Communications, Ltd. (collectively referenced as Payphone Providers). On May 23, 1995, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a memorandum recommending that the Commission cancel the Payphone Providers' Certificates of Service Authority. Although no formal request has been filed by any of the Payphone Providers, Staff based its recommendation on its belief that

the Payphone Providers had violated the terms of their certificates and are no longer providing pay telephone service.

In its memorandum, Staff noted that the Commission's Orders granting the certificates in question specifically state that the Payphone Providers should remain subject to the provisions of Section 392.390(1) and (3), RSMo., which provides for the filing of annual reports and Section 386.370, RSMo., which provides for the assessment of utilities. Staff stated that the Payphone Providers have failed to file both their 1993 Statements of Revenue and their 1993 Annual Reports. Staff also stated that it has made repeated attempts to contact the Payphone Providers by mail and telephone without success. Staff recommended that the Commission cancel the Payphone Providers' Certificates of Service Authority based on Staff's belief that the Payphone Providers have violated the terms of their certificates by failing to file annual reports and statement of revenue forms, and are no longer providing pay telephone service.

Upon review of Staff's memorandum, the Commission finds that the Payphone Providers have violated the terms of their certificates by failing to file annual reports and statement of revenue forms. Thus, the Commission determines that the Payphone Providers' Certificates of Service Authority should be canceled.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the Certificates of Service Authority issued to Ira Rubin/
Diamond Communications, Global Hospitality, Inc., and Exchange Communications,

Ltd. are hereby canceled.

2. That this Order shall become effective on June 12, 1995.
