## ORDER GRANTING ADMISSION PRO HAC VICE

On April 3, 2002, Rebecca B. DeCook, a member of the Colorado Bar, filed her entry of appearance in this matter on behalf of AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc. Although Ms. DeCook did not move for admission *pro hac vice,* the Commission will construe her entry of appearance as constituting such a motion.
