ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS FOR INTERVENTION

On May 15, 2000, Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL) filed an application with the Commission for authority to restructure and reorganize itself, merge, transfer assets and form subsidiary corporations. KCPL proposes to separate its generation assets from its transmission, distribution and customer service assets by creation of separate affiliated companies owned by a common holding company.

On May 16, the Commission issued an Order and Notice that directed all interested parties to file an application to intervene no later than June 15. Timely applications requesting intervention were filed by Laclede Gas Company, GS Technologies Operating Co., Inc. d/b/a GST Steel Company, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local Unions No. 412, 1464 and 1613, St. Joseph Light & Power Company, the Missouri Joint Municipal Electric Utility Commission, the Missouri Energy



Group¹, UtiliCorp United Inc., the City of Kansas City, Missouri, The Empire District Electric Company, Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company, Western Resources, Inc., Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE, and the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers². No party has filed an objection to any of the requests to intervene.

The Commission has reviewed the applications to intervene and finds that each is in compliance with Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.075. Each of the prospective intervenors has an interest in this matter that is different from that of the general public and which may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case. Granting each of the proposed interventions would serve the public interest. The Commission concludes that each of the applications for intervention should be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Application to Intervene of Laclede Gas Company is granted.
- 2. That the Motion to Intervene of GS Technologies Operating Co., Inc. d/b/a GST Steel Company, is granted.

- 7. That the Application to Intervene of UtiliCorp United Inc. is granted.
- 8. That the Application to Intervene of the City of Kansas City, Missouri is granted.
- 9. That the Motion to Intervene of The Empire District Electric Company is granted.
- 10. That the Application for Intervention of Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company, is granted.
- 11. That the Application to Intervene of Western Resources, Inc. is granted.
- 12. That the Application to Intervene of Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE is granted.
- 13. That the Application to Intervene of the Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers is granted.
