NOTICE OF DEFICIENCY

On February 28, 2007, Missouri-American Water Company filed an application with the Commission requesting a certificate of convenience and necessity expanding its ability to provide sewer service in Platte County, Missouri, and allowing it to participate in the extension of a sewer utility for a new residential development known as the Montebella Subdivision.

On March 21, 2007, the Platte County Regional Sewer District filed a letter in the electronic case file. The letter comments on the application, requests to be kept informed regarding this area of service, and states that the "PCRSD does not consent to sanitary sewer being provided in this area by parties other than [PCRSD]." The letter is not signed by an attorney.

The Commission views this letter as a request for intervention and objection to the application. As such, it does not comply with Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(1) regarding pleadings, which states that every pleading shall be signed by at least one

attorney of record unless filed on behalf of a person or entity which can legally represent itself. An application for intervention must also comply with 4 CSR 240-2.075.

Although the intervention deadline has passed, the Commission will grant the Platte County Regional Sewer District an extension to refile its request to be made a party to this case or to file any formal objections. The District may file its pleading no later than April 30, 2007.
