ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE

Issue Date: April 25, 2013

Effective Date: May 5, 2013

This order cancels the private pay telephone certificate of Cinemark USA, Inc.

On April 10, 2013, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion requesting Cinemark's certificate to provide private pay telephone service in the State of Missouri be canceled.

In Case Number TA-99-384, the Commission granted Cinemark a certificate of service authority to provide private pay telephone service in the State of Missouri via customer-owned coin-operated telephone equipment.

Staff's motion states that the company requested cancellation of its certificate of service authority. Staff recommends that the Commission cancel Cinemark's certificate of service authority as the company is no longer providing service in Missouri.

On April 11, 2013, the Commission issued an Order Directing Notice allowing any parties to file an objection or request a hearing to do so no later than April 22, 2013. No objections or requests for a hearing were filed.

The Commission has the authority to cancel a certificate and tariff pursuant to Section 392.410.5, RSMo (Supp. 2012), which states, in part, “[a]ny

certificate or service authority may be altered or modified by the commission after notice and hearing, upon its own motion or upon application of the person or company affected.”

Based on Cinemark’s request and Staff’s motion, the Commission finds that the private payphone certificate granted to Cinemark USA, Inc., shall be canceled.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The private payphone certificate granted to Cinemark USA, Inc., in Case Number TA-99-384, is canceled.
2. This order shall become effective on May 5, 2013.
3. This case may be closed on May 6, 2013.
