**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME**

On August 26, 1997, the Commission issued its order approving a certificate of convenience and necessity for Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL), allowing KCPL to reroute three 161 kV power lines outside its service territory. As part of that order, the Commission ordered KCPL to file tariffs reflecting the concise route description and territorial boundaries of the certificate. On September 15, 1997, KCPL filed a motion for an extension of time in which to file the requested tariffs stating that KCPL has been unable to complete the route description and maps of the territory in the allotted time. KCPL requests an additional 30 days in which to file the necessary tariffs.

The Commission finds that no detriment will result from granting the requested extension of time and will, therefore, extend the deadline for the filing of the tariffs for an additional 30 days, to October 20, 1997.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That the deadline for filing tariffs in compliance with the Commission order of August 26, 1997 is hereby extended to October 20, 1997.

2. That this order shall become effective on September 19, 1997.
