# ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

NTI Telecom, Inc. (NTI) applied to the Public Service Commission on September 2, 1997, for a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.440, RSMo 1994. NTI asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. NTI is a Nevada corporation, with its principal office located at 101 Convention Center Drive, Suite P-125, Las Vegas, Nevada 89109.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications and Opportunity to Intervene on September 16, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by October 1. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496

(Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application.

NTI filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on October 14, November 3 and November 13. The tariff's effective date is November 27. NTI's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies NTI as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. NTI intends to provide interexchange telecommunications services including intrastate intraLATA and interLATA interexchange services, including 1+ direct dial, 800 number, directory assistance, operator and travel card services throughout the state of Missouri.

In its Memorandum filed on November 18, the Staff of the Commission stated that NTI's proposed services are similar to existing IXC offerings. Staff recommended that the Commission grant NTI a certificate of service authority, competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff to become effective on November 27.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange telecommunications market is in the public interest and NTI should be granted a certificate of service authority. The Commission finds that the services NTI proposes to offer are competitive and NTI should be classified as a competitive company. Waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in Ordered Paragraph 2 is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission determines, by authority of Section 392.470, that NTI should comply with the following regulatory requirements as reasonable and necessary conditions of certification:

- (1) NTI must comply with reasonable requests by Staff for financial and operating data to allow Staff to monitor the intraLATA toll market. § 386.320.3.
- (2) NTI must file tariffs containing rules and regulations applicable to customers, a description of the services provided, and a list of rates associated with those services in accordance with 4 CSR 240-30.010 and Section 392.220, RSMo Supp. 1996.
- (3) NTI may not unjustly discriminate between its customers. \$\$ 392.200, RSMo Supp. 1996, 392.400.
- (4) NTI must comply with all applicable rules of the Commission except those specifically waived by this order. §§ 386.570, 392.360.
- (5) NTI must file a Missouri-specific annual report. §§ 392.210, 392.390.1.
- (6) NTI must comply with jurisdictional reporting requirements as set out in each local exchange company's access services tariffs. § 392.390.3.
- (7) NTI must submit to the Staff, on a confidential basis, a copy of the jurisdictional report it submits to local exchange companies. The report must be submitted within ten days of the date on which it is submitted to the local exchange company.

The Commission finds that NTI's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and is similar to tariffs approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange carriers. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on September 2 shall be approved as amended to become effective on November 27.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That NTI Telecom, Inc. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.
- 2. That NTI Telecom, Inc. is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. The following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
