8	Q.	What is your affiliation with Lake Area Waste Water Association, Inc.
9		("LAWWA")?
10	A.	I am an administrator.
11		
12	Q.	What is your affiliation with Missouri Water Association, Inc. ("MWA")?
13	A.	I am an administrator.
14		
15	Q.	How long have these entities been in operation?
16	A.	Since 2010.
17		
18	Q.	Please generally describe the business of LAWWA.
19	A.	Lake Area Waste Water Association, Inc. is a nonprofit sewer company that
20		provides sewage collection services to its Members. It was formed pursuant to
21		sections 393.825 to 393.861 and section 393.175 RSMo., for the specific purpose
22		of owning and operating wastewater treatment systems. LAWWA is a not for
23		profit company with voluntary membership. Membership is gained by applying

1 for and receiving sewer services from LAWWA. LAWWA falls into IRS tax 2 category 501(C)(12), and operates in a similar fashion as an electric cooperative. 3 LAWWA is governed by a Board of Directors that are elected by the Members 4 pursuant to RSMo 393.843. 5 LAWWA has over 2700 members consisting of over 50 treatment facilities 6 throughout the state with its principal location of Camdenton Missouri. The bulk 7 of the membership is located in Camden, Miller and Morgan Counties. LAWWA 8 maintains individual home and community lift stations, service connections and 9 force mains as well as gravity lines to the wastewater treatment facilities. Types 10 of treatment that LAWWA has are extended aeration, recirculating sand filters. 11 and advantex (packed bed media filters).

Q. Please generally describe the business of MWA.

14 A. Missouri Water Association, Inc. is a nonprofit sewer company that provides 15 water treatment services to its Members. It was formed pursuant to sections 16 393.900 to 393.951 and Chapter 355 RSMo., for the specific purpose of owning 17 and operating drinking water systems. MWA is a not for profit company with 18 voluntary membership. Membership is gained by applying for and receiving 19 water services from MWA. MWA falls into IRS tax category 501(C)(12), and 20 operates in a similar fashion as an electric cooperative. MWA is governed by a 21 Board of Directors that are elected by the Members pursuant to RSMo 393.927. 22 MWA has over 1000 members with 20 water production wells with its principal 23 location of Camdenton Missouri. The memberships are located in Camden,

1		Mille	r and Morgan counties. MWA is responsible for the source, pumps, storage,
2		and d	istribution to the service connection. Types of treatment that MWA has
3		includ	le chlorination (disinfection and iron removal), softening and filtration.
