2	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Good morning,
3	everyone. We're here for a prehearing
4	conference in Case No. ST-2003-0562 and
5	WT-2003-0563, which involves the sewer and
6	tariff filings of Osage Water Company and
7	it's, in fact, a rate case. We'll begin today
8	by taking entries of appearance beginning with
9	Osage Water Company.
10	MR. WILLIAMS: My name is Gregory

14	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
15	MR. BATES: Bruce H. Bates appearing
16	on behalf of the staff of Missouri Public
17	Commission. My address is Post Office Box
18	360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. Public
20	counsel?
21	MS. O'NEILL: Yes. Good morning.

25	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Thank

1 you. Are there any matters we need to take up on the record? I don't believe there's any 2 3 pending motions or anything out there. MR. WILLIAMS: I don't think so, 4 5 your Honor. Mr. Mitchell and I did kind of look at your order for scheduling a hearing 6 and wondered -- it seemed to be an awful lot of days for a case for a company this size. I 8 think you've got --9 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Two weeks. 10 11 MR. WILLIAMS: Eight days of hearings and three days for a true-up, and we 12 13 really don't think it's going to take that 14 much time. 15 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Well, I hope not 16 either. But I wanted to grab the dates while 17 I could just in case it did. Certainly, 18 that's a matter for you to discuss today. And 19 if you all feel that that's too much, let me 20 know, and we can free up some days on the Commission's calendar. And I'm sure a lot of 21 22 the other judges will appreciate that, too, 23 because that's a very busy time. There are 24 three or four other rate cases going on at the 25 same time. So let me know if that is

1	appropriate. And certainly the need for a
2	true-up. is another question as to whether or
3	not you need the true-up.
4	Well, then I'll leave you to your
5	discussions today. Of course, the main task
6	that you have is to prepare a proposed
7	procedural schedule, and including the length
8	that you think you need for the hearing.
9	You're all going to need to give me a
10	recommendation about a proposed testure and
11	the true-up.
12	And as you indicated, the hearing is
13	going to begin on January 20th, unless you
14	tell me otherwise or suggest otherwise. So
15	unless there's anything else anyone needs on
16	the record yes, Mr. Bates?
17	MR. BATES: Excuse me, your Honor.
18	And I may have missed it. But did you set a
19	date by which the procedural schedule should
20	be submitted?
21	JUDGE WOODRUFF: I probably did not.
22	Thank you for bringing that to my attention.
23	Let's make it one week from today.
24	MR. BATES: Okay.
25	THE COURT: Which would be, I guess,

1	the 14th. Any other matters anyone wants to
2	bring up while we're on the record? All
3	right. With that, then, the on-the-record
4	portion of this conference is adjourned.
