ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting the *Motion for Protective Order* (“motion”).¹ The motion cites the Commission regulation that provides protection for certain information.² That regulation provides protection, without an order from the commission, for such information disclosed in response to discovery³ or in testimony.⁴ For other disclosures, the regulation provides:

In addition to discovery and testimony which may be designated as highly confidential or proprietary without a protective order from the commission as set out in this rule, any person may seek an order protecting information from disclosure by the commission.[⁵]

The motion seeks protection for information disclosed in the answer to the complaint, which the Commission's regulation requires.⁶ The motion describes information subject to protection.⁷ Therefore, the Commission will grant the motion.
