## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On August 19, 1993, Osage Water Company (Osage) filed an application with the Commission seeking a certificate of convenience and necessity to provide sewer service. On April 28, 1994, Osage filed an amended application.

On August 25, 1995, a hearing in this case was convened as scheduled.

In the hearing, Osage indicated that it intended to withdraw its application.

No communication was forthcoming from Osage and on October 11, 1995, the Commission issued a Notice advising the parties to this case that unless it was shown good cause to the contrary by October 31, 1995, this case would be subject to dismissal. As of the date of this Order, there has been no communication from any of the parties, including Osage.

The Commission finds that Osage has abandoned its application, as amended. Thus, the Commission finds that Osage's application, as amended, should be dismissed.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Osage Water Company's application for a certificate of convenience and necessity, as amended, is hereby dismissed.
  - 2. That Case No. SA-94-54 is hereby closed.
  - 3. That this Order shall become effective on November 28, 1995.
